request or over promise to help someone who is in need and then unintentionally never follow up? Words are not bad but our words should meet our actions.



# CREATIVE UPDATES



While we are not out of the woods yet with the pandemic, we are thrilled that we are able to bring our weekly publication back to those attending Mass each week. Hopefully, this helps to make things feel just a bit more like 'normal.'





## WEBSITE UPDATE

Along with the return of the bulletin, today we are also launching an updated website. I've spent hundreds of hours over the last many months

developing a new site from the ground up to optimize the experience for parishioners and guests. While there are many new and updated features with the site, I am going to share with you my top five. I hope that you will take time to check them out.

All of this and more sums up to what I think is a much better experience for users visiting our site. We have continued to see an increase in traffic as a result of COVID, our broadcast Mass, and all of the great content that our staff is sharing. There has never been a more important time to have a strong digital presence than right now. While I still have more ideas of ways to improve and enhance the site moving forward, this marks a big milestone with the importance of the digital church and keeping us all connected.



## STUNNING NEW DESIGN

The new version of our website introduces a fresh modern design. Every element has been carefully crafted to highlight the beauty of the imagery and content that it contains and reflect the boldness of our modern church identity. A lot has changed since the last major update to our website with how people use our site. The new site was created with this in mind and puts spiritual content such as articles and videos at the forefront in addition to key components such as livestream, bulletins, and info for first-timers.

I am also very proud to share that our new site will have a dark mode! This means that when you visit our site on a mobile or desktop device that has native dark mode support (and enabled), the theme of the site will reflect your preference. Using dark mode on your devices has both health and well-being benefits as well as being a great way to save battery. Everyone can relate to being in a room where the lights are turned down and you've got this white screen blinding you. While less than 3% of websites in the world support this, I am proud to say that ours does!

## DYNAMIC SEARCH


With over 1200 posts on our website, it can be difficult to find exactly what you are looking for. Well we've built a new search engine for the site that will quickly display results based on what you type without even having to press enter. The search engine should also continue to get smarter by learning what users search for and prioritizing those search results.

## SPEED

With the site being rewritten from the ground up, speed was a top priority. Our new site has optimized code and loading functions, as well as a new backend platform that all result in pages loading up to 60% faster than the previous version of the site.

## PRAYER WALL

The Prayer Wall is a brand new component built to help parishioners, guests, and staff stay connected in prayer even while we are far apart. It is a place where anyone can share a prayer intention and also pray for others. That prayer intention can be for someone who is sick, who has died, for strength, in thanksgiving, or just a personal intention. I tried to make the experience as simple as possible with minimal information being asked from the user. There is also the option for you to ask to have someone contact you to pray together. Our connection through prayer has never been more important! Some recent Prayer Wall posts will be included in our bulletin each week.



## VIRTUAL BULLETIN

Although our website has always been a great place to find more up-to-date content than what is found in the bulletin, it was scattered throughout the site making it a challenge to find what you are looking for. Well that is no longer the case! We've created a single page that contains the most up-to-date information that can be found in the bulletin and across our site and pulls it into a single location. This includes new additions such as funerals, baptisms, and offertory reports. This page dynamically pulls in the latest info from other parts of our site and lays it out in a seamless format. We will continue to update this page to include additional features. Don't worry, you can still download PDFs of the bulletin as well if you prefer!

# SITE HOLDS BOTTLE DRIVE FOR MCCREST

Many people wander the streets, maybe alone, or maybe with family, sleep on benches, struggle to get food, and wear dirty, old clothes with no place to call home.

Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter Team (MCREST) is an organization that provides help such as shelter, food, life-skills training, housing assistance, job training, and emergency shelter to homeless and displaced people in Macomb County. Supporting MCREST through monetary or physical means is one way for anyone to support the community.

Because St. Isidore annually takes part in the MCREST program, volunteers from various organizations helped by making meals for this year's guests:

Hoping to raise \$200 for their meal, SITE decided to host a bottle drive starting on July 13, 2020. When there was a great response to the bottle drive, the goal was raised to \$2,000, hoping to pay for the music ministry's meal as well as the hotel bills. Once the bottle, can, and monetary donations surpassed \$2,000, the goal increased to \$4,000 in hopes of being able to donate more to the estimated \$4,100 hotel expense as those in the program were housed at a hotel this year instead of the church for safety.

As of 9/10/20 the parish has collected \$9,707.01, which includes \$6,080.00 collected by SITE. (Any proceeds collected beyond the 2020 MCREST expenses will be set aside to support next year's MCREST program at St. Isidore.)

Thank you for supporting SITE in such a way that it allows us to assist those who are most in need, and thank you also for the outpouring of donations that has allowed us to go beyond our original \$200 goal.



# ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

---

The St. Vincent de Paul Pantry has stayed open since the shutdown started, although the church has been closed. We are very grateful to Fr. Ron for supporting us in our work and to Matt Kush for publishing our pantry articles on the St. Isidore website. St. Isidore Church staff have also been very helpful in handing out emergency bags of food to our neighbors in need and collecting donations of food and money during this pandemic. We absolutely could not do our mission of serving others without all of their help.

If you haven't been looking at the church website, early in the shutdown we published articles about our Easter Food Distribution in March and about how our pantry operates, which includes pictures of the pantry and how we pack emergency bags of food. We also had a Back To School Food Distribution on August 18th. Both Distributions used a drive through process to keep our Vincentians and families safe.

Donations by our generous parishioners have also helped our neighbors with rent and utility assistance and helped keep our Pantry stocked and we are very grateful to everyone. 
