

# **CONNECTING POINT**

How can discipline keep me on the narrow path?

My father was a big fan of bowling. Nothing gave him more satisfaction than sending the bowling ball down that narrow lane to score a strike. Now he knew that if that ball was off track, even a tiny bit, it would end in the gutter and there would be no points. If you did not practice and were not disciplined in your technique then you would not succeed.

However, if you practiced, remained focused, and stay disciplined you may come home with the perfect 300 score.
Many times, my father returned home as a member of the 300 Club knowing that all his hard work got him where he wanted to be and the reward was exhilarating.

In today's gospel, Jesus talks with us about the narrow path in life that leads us to the greatest gift there is, the Kingdom of God. He reminds us that this path is not easy and many will not succeed. What do we need to do to succeed on this narrow path as a disciple of Christ? The best answer comes from the word

disciple itself, we need to have discipline.

Following Jesus takes work. As we begin our journey, initially putting ourselves in a position to succeed and commit to practicing our faith seem reasonable. Yet, as we continue through our life we are called to put God first and to share the good news with others. The narrow path starts to become more difficult and can conflict with our secular society.

It is discipline that helps keep us on the narrow path. We know there will be rough times but if we keep focused and are dedicated to our faith then we will experience the greatest joy imaginable. We know that the salvation Jesus offers is for all of us. Will you begin the journey and use discipline to travel the narrow path? The reward will be exhilarating... it will be the Kingdom of God.

As we enter into another election cycle, I would like to share the directives we must follow as a parish.

First though, I would like to remind you that it is both our civic and moral responsibility to be engaged in the political process and to vote. We need to take time to know the various candidates, and to be guided in our voting by the Church's teachings, especially the teachings on social justice: protecting human life and dignity, and serving the needs of the poor and vulnerable.

Due to our tax-exempt status, IRS regulations prohibit the parish from endorsing or opposing individual

candidates or parties. This includes preaching, bulletin articles, signage of any kind, and the distribution of partisan campaign literature. Also, according to the directives we have received from the Michigan Catholic Conference, the only Election Guides we can distribute are those published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Michigan Catholic Conference, or the Archdiocese of Detroit. We will be making such guides accessible and available as they are published. Please take time to study them.

In the past, parishioners have placed Election Guides from other organizations, and other partisan materials, in the church. This is strictly prohibited. We will have to dispose of any such items.

We must all vote according to an informed conscience, and respect those whose politics are different from our own. We cannot allow the deep divisions in our country, and the violence they engender, to cause division within our parish. With one heart and one mind let us work together to further the mission of Jesus Christ.

# ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL BLOOD DRIVE!

Our last blood drive was a success in several ways. First, and most importantly, we had 51 people sign up to give blood. Of that 51, 41 showed up to donate blood. Of that 41, the Red Cross collected 38 pints of blood. That is a 92.68% donation rate which is fantastic. Secondly, the Red Cross has improved their system so that no one was here longer than one hour from signing in, interview with a nurse, and completion of donation.

At that same time, Bridget McCormmick, our Red Cross liaison presented St. Isidore with a certificate of appreciation. This was in part for St. Isidore's continued practice of hosting three blood drives a year, especially during the height of the Pandemic. St. Isidore continued to host blood drives while other venues discontinued their blood drive efforts.

A big **thank you** to all who donated. Your donation will help to save many lives.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

#### **OUR LADY OF KNOCK**

On the evening of August 21, 1879, in the village of Knock, County Mayo, the housekeeper of the local parish church saw the south, outside wall of the church bathed in a light of unknown origin. Going to fetch a friend, she and her companion came back to witness an apparition of Virgin Mary, with two others figures, who were understood to be St. Joseph and John the Evangelist. In addition, there was an altar, with a cross and a lamb on it. Others gathered and likewise saw the figures. A notable feature of this apparition is that Mary was silent. Acceptance of authenticity was slow - some local ecclesiastical authorities suspected a hoax by the local Protestant constable! Today Knock is the site of a large basilica and a dedicated place of pilgrimage. Once celebrated on August 21 in the Roman calendar, the feast has been moved to August 13 to make way for Pope St. Pius X. (Ancient Order of Hiberians Catholic Calendar)
