The Third Sunday of Advent is known as the Sunday of Joy in our Advent Season. The color is rose which is meant to symbolize the color on the horizon just before sunrise. As joyous as this Sunday is, knowing that we are almost to Christmas, in our personal lives outside of church, it can easily be a time of stress.

It's a weekend when most

Christmas parties fall, where we are trying to wrap up our Christmas shopping, and get everything done for Christmas which is now just two weeks away. As a family, share the joy of Gaudette Sunday by lighting the pink Advent candle. Pray as a family on how you can bring joy to others.

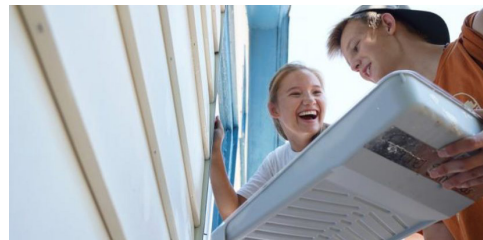

Prayer blankets and shawls are available in the church office during normal business hours and after all Sunday morning Masses.

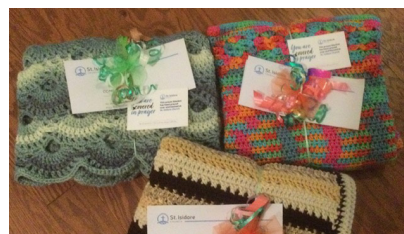

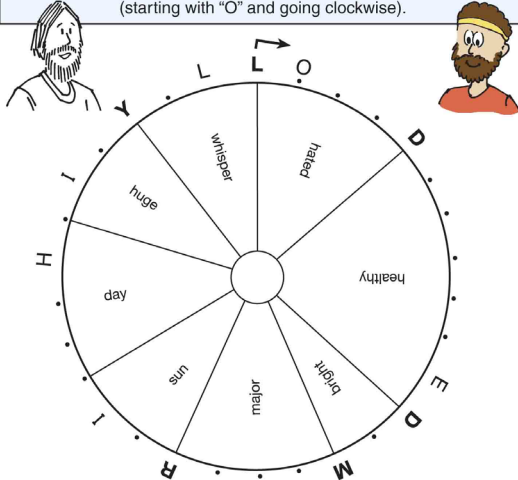

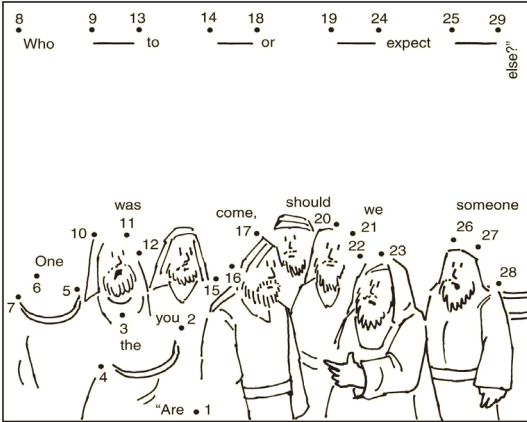
