But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you.

Romans 8:9

There's a lot to unpack in that question above! As I prayed on it, I kept coming back to the main theme of the readings this week; Resurrection Hope. This Fifth Sunday of Lent challenges us to focus our desires on sharing in eternal life with the risen Lord. But how do we do that and how do we connect the

idea of resurrection with the Spirit and God's forgiveness? Let's start with the word "resurrection," which comes from the Hebrew for to "rise up." We can think of "rising up" in a few different ways. There's the literal way to take it, and we hear of the rising up of Lazarus in the Gospel. But there are other ways to think

about "rising up."

When I was a young boy, I was blessed to get to sit with my Papa out under the carport at his house in Detroit. We would share a Sprite and he would tell me stories about his time behind the wheel. My Papa was a truck driver for Anheuser-Busch for many years. He would tell me about some of the "sticky situations" he would get into on

the roadways and always told me "Johnny, you have to rise above and forgive people when they act nutty." "Rise up" and forgive! God commanded us to forgive one another not seven times, but seven times seventy! But sometimes we may need a "nudge" to help us ask for that forgiveness. Cue the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit, the Advocate, that resides within us and urges us to "rise up" and forgive like Christ

taught us. It's the Spirit that can work through us to show God's forgiveness to others.

We are called to be witnesses and to forgive like Christ forgave. May this Lenten season continue to challenge us to "rise up," listen to the Spirit's nudge and let the Spirit use us as joyful missionary disciples to spread God's love and forgiveness.





#### **Eucharastic Miracles Exhibition**

Vatican International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles will be on display 3/30/23 - 4/5/23.

Why: Many Christians, including some Catholics, do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In fact this teaching is clearly supported by the Bible (see Jesus' promise of the Eucharist, Jn. 6; the institution narratives in Mt. 26: 26-28, Mk 14: 22-24, Lk 23:19-20; and warnings against abuse 1 Cor. 11: 27-29). Some believe the mystery but do not grasp its implications or its dynamic power to impact their daily lives. Eucharistic miracles are a gift from God that recall us to the deeper meaning of this mystery of our faith.

Pope John Paul II started his encyclical letter on the Eucharist, *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, with the simple yet profound statement: "The Church draws her life from the

Eucharist." Apart from Jesus, we can do nothing (John 15:5). So, whether it is an honest day's work, playing with the kids at the park, leading family prayer, visiting the sick, feeding the poor, teaching RCIA, or rescuing babies from abortion, it is all possible because of Jesus. It is this same Jesus who is present in the Eucharist. So whether we realize it or not, the power of Jesus in the Eucharist enables us to live out our faith. The Catechism puts it this way: "the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith" (CCC 1327).

In Ecclesia de Eucharistia, the Holy Father reminds us: "Every commitment to holiness, every activity aimed at carrying out the Church's mission, every work of pastoral planning, must draw the strength it needs from the Eucharistic mystery and in turn be directed to that mystery as its

culmination. In the Eucharist we have Jesus, we have his redemptive sacrifice, we have his resurrection, we have the gift of the Holy Spirit, we have adoration, obedience and love of the Father. Were we to disregard the Eucharist, how could we overcome our own deficiency?" (#60)

The importance of the Eucharist to our daily lives cannot be overstated. This exhibition can help reawaken or deepen our Eucharistic faith, draw us into a more intimate relationship with Jesus, and bring about a renewed commitment to, and enthusiasm and fervor to live our Christian faith more dynamically as individuals and as a parish.

# Divine Mercy: Chaplet

As we move along discussing the letters in the acronym F.I.N.C.H., today we look at C = CHAPLET.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed on ordinary rosary beads. Jesus directed Faustina: First of all you will say one OUR FATHER, one HAIL MARY and the I BELIEVE IN GOD. Then on the OUR FATHER beads you will say the following words: "Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

On the HAIL MARY beads, you will say the following words: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion have mercy on us and on the whole world."

In conclusion, three times you will recite these words: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One,

have mercy on us and on the whole world." (Diary 476)

Vatican II tells us that by virtue of our Baptism, we participate in the three offices of Christ: Priest, Prophet, and King. The Chaplet is powerful in that it enables us individually to use our priestly power to offer atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

Jesus promised those who pray the Chaplet:

- "Will receive great mercy at the hour of death... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy."
   (Diary 687)
- "The souls that say this chaplet will be embraced by My Mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death." (Diary 754)



Say this chaplet daily. Pamphlets can be found in the Gathering Space. Next week we look at the last letter in the acronym F.I.N.C.H. H = HOUR.

## Lenten Giving Tree - 2023

#### Lenten Giving Tree Chairperson

This week's article will focus on Cross Catholic Outreach: Wells of Salvation - Ghana, Malawi and Zambia.\*

**Description**: Families in Ghana, Malawi and Zambia face a daily struggle for survival, in part because they lack access to safe, clean water. By providing their communities with clean water, improved sanitation and new opportunities to feed and educate their children, you can help the Church empower these families, enabling them to escape extreme poverty.

Project Summary: This project will install 69 wells, build sanitary latrines with 25 toilets, and provide valuable training in communities battling frequent drought conditions and problems with waterborne diseases. This outreach will also build three new schools and add two classrooms to an existing school. Together, this range of development efforts will help end the burden of water scarcity, enhance educational opportunities, improve public health and foster the holistic transformation of poverty-stricken communities.

Location: The three Dioceses are:

- The Diocese of Wa in Ghana's Upper West Region
- The Diocese of Karonga in northern Malawi, and

 The Diocese of Chipata in Zambia's Eastern Province

#### Highlights:

#### **NEED**

- In rural Sub-Saharan Africa, much of the population relies on unreliable, inadequate water sources typically contaminated streams or ponds, or poorly constructed wells. This murky water is often tainted with animal waste, parasites, bacteria and chemicals that can cause serious illnesses.
- Many poor families end up spending an exorbitant amount of time and energy on water collection, which robs them of valuable hours better spent on work or the education of their children.

#### **IMPACT**

- Ghana: With your help, we can fund two wells to serve 941 people in two communities and 25 sanitary latrine toilets that will serve 1,331 in three communities. This outreach will also build three new schools and a teachers' quarters for a community with no other local school options. We are also funding medical housing and a multi-purpose building.
- Malawi: Your support will also help us drill 12 wells for

- communities in need of a clean, reliable water source. The water supply produced will benefit 4,300 people! We are also constructing a two-classroom building for an existing school to alleviate overcrowding.
- Zambia: With your help, we can fund 55 wells for 56,904 people in need of clean water



# Did You Know? April's Fool Day

Some historians speculate that April Fools' Day dates back to 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar as called for by the Council of Trent in 1563. In the Julian calendar, as in the Hindu calendar, the new year began with the spring equinox around April 1. People who were slow to get the news or failed to recognize that the start of the new year had moved to Jan 1 and continued to celebrate it during the

last week of March through April 1 became the butt of jokes and hoaxes and were called "April fools." These pranks included having paper fish placed on their backs and being referred to as "poisonn d'avril" (April fish), said to symbolize a young, easily caught fish and a gullible person.
