I was bent in half, pinned down and received a broken ankle for my efforts. This experience put an end to my season and eventually I bowed out of that

who invites us to follow him. This weekend we gather to celebrate Palm Sunday that will lead us into Holy Week. We will take part in remembering this joyful event by taking up our own palm branches, waving them back and forth. We enter the Church as followers of Christ, but how far are we willing to walk with Jesus?

Our journey is made up of relationships that try our patience, health issues, disappointments, tragedies, and temptations. Our Lord knows that we need the gift

of grace, the gift of his sacrifice to finish the race. He provides us with the ultimate example by becoming human and walking the journey himself. He knows what it is like to be challenged by life. He knows that we will stumble along the way. Even Jesus' own disciples turned away from him. Judas betrayed him, James and John were not able to stay awake with him and Peter denied him three times. However, those who seek repentance and continue to move forward on the journey will be rewarded with eternal joy. No matter what stands

in our way he stands with us even when we turn away from him. We may feel defeated. We may feel that we are challenged beyond our limits, but we have the strength of our heavenly father within us as we receive him at the Eucharist. So, as we walk in procession with our palm branches waving back and forth, we are signaling our yes to our beloved father in heaven. His disciples are willing to go the distance with him because we are restored in faith and saved by love.

▶ Divine Mercy: Hour

This is the 6th and final article about Divine Mercy. We're to the last letter of the acronym F.I.N.C.H. H=HOUR.

What is this hour?

Because Jesus died on the Cross at 3:00 PM, every day between 3-4 in the afternoon is known as the "Hour of Great Mercy." During this hour, Jesus asked Faustina to pray the Stations of the Cross, provided her duties permitted it.

"At three o'clock, implore My mercy,

especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy for the whole world. I will allow you to enter into My mortal sorrow. In this hour, I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion..." (Diary 1320)

What Jesus wants above all through

devotion at the Hour of Mercy is to recall his sacrifice of love on the Cross. Many people choose to say the Chaplet at the three o'clock hour; it takes about 10 minutes and focuses on Christ's Passion. Thus we can look at this hour as a mini-Divine Mercy Sunday that arrives every day giving us an opportunity to pray for loved ones, the conversion of unrepentant sinners and consoles Christ's sorrowful heart.



The Strawberry Festival committee is already hard at work planning this year's festival. An integral part of the festival is the Strawberry Patch, and this year will be no different. Last fall our St. Vincent de Paul Conference Food Pantry was blessed when we were selected by the new Meijer Grocery Store on 24 Mile Rd. and Hayes for their *Simply Give* program. We are one of two local Food Pantries selected for this program at this store. This signature program has generated more than \$75 million, thanks to the continued generosity and support of Meijer

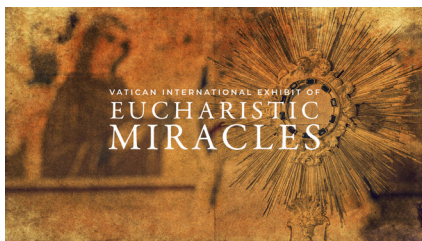
customers, team members and food pantry partners who are committed to helping feed hungry families.

Meijer customers are encouraged to purchase a \$10 *Simply Give* donation card (not a Meijer gift card) located in a kiosk near the checkout. Once purchased, the donation is converted into a Meijer Food-Only Gift Card and donated directly to our SVdP Food Pantry. Meijer customers shopping online using Meijer pickup or home delivery can also purchase *Simply Give* donation cards as an add-on to their orders.

Our Pantry is part of the store's "Spring Campaign" which begins

April 2 and runs to July 1. A double-your-donation day will be on Saturday, June 17 where any purchase of a \$10 *Simply Give* donation card will be doubled by the store. Each \$10 donation will turn into \$30 for our Pantry. We will keep you updated as this day gets closer. We will continue to publish our weekly article with a list of items the Pantry needs.
