At the Last Supper, Jesus told the

disciples they would grieve for a while, but that their grief would be turned into joy. This promise was fulfilled on Easter Sunday morning when Mary Magdalene, grieving outside the tomb, realized that the man she thought was the gardener was the risen Lord. When Jesus pronounced her name, she was so

overjoyed that she ran to the other disciples to share her joy with them.

Like Mary Magdalene, as disciples unleashed of the Risen Lord, we are called to share our joy with others during this Easter Season. It was the joy of the first Christians that attracted others to follow Jesus.
