There is a lot of noise in our lives. Everywhere we go, we are bombarded with it: cell phone chirps and rings, music from radios and speakers, TVs and monitors blaring the latest talk show or news program, and the list goes on. In an effort to “stay connected,” we are never devoid of noise.

Yet, silence is necessary. It helps us

focus. It gives us time to think. It makes us pause. In 1952, composer John Cage wrote a piece of music entitled 4’33” (“Four Minutes, Thirty-Three Seconds”), in which the performer remains silent for four minutes and thirty-three seconds. But, the performance is far from silent as the audience becomes aware of ambient noise (air conditioning, coughs, whispers,

traffic, etc.). The piece invites both performer and listener to be introspective. Of course, for those who don’t know what the piece is about, the silence is uncomfortable. People shift in their chairs. They want some kind of noise to interrupt their thoughts.

The same thing happens in church. When the priest pauses for more

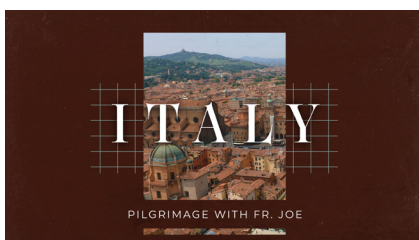

## ▶ Connecting Point (cont'd)

than ten seconds, people become disturbed. They want music, words, something, anything—because the silence becomes unbearable. We are so used to the noise of everyday life that when it is gone, we become irritated. Yet, we need to be silent in order to hear the voice of the shepherd.

He speaks to us in whispers. God speaks to us in the silence of our hearts. If our lives are continually filled up with noise, we may miss what God is saying to us. Sheep hear the voice of the shepherd, but if they become distracted by other sights or sounds, they may wander away. If we allow the noise of the world to occupy our thoughts, we, too, run the risk of wandering away

from God.

Here are some suggestions:

1. Schedule some “silent time” every day. Perhaps you may want to go into your yard, take a walk and commune in nature, or simply sit in a chair.
2. Turn off the phone, TV, or radio. Don't listen to music. Simply sit in silence.
3. Try to ignore the ambient noise: ticking clocks, birds twittering, ambulance sirens, etc.
4. Begin by asking the Lord to open your heart so you may more intently listen to his voice.
5. Control your breathing—inhalation while praying the words, “Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living

God,” then exhale and pray the words, “have mercy on me a sinner.”

6. Repeat this several times. As you enter into this mantra, let the Lord speak to you and listen intently.
7. See what happens.

The length of time you spend in silence does not matter. Start with five minutes and gradually increase the amount of time. You will be surprised at the changes silence makes in your life. Allow yourself the luxury to hear the voice of the Good Shepherd in order to become more like him so that we might have life- and have it more abundantly.

## ▶ Weekly Eucharistic Adoration

We are in need of additional regular weekly coverage for the hours of 12:30-1:30 and 2:30-3:30. We also

need additional people who can serve as an occasional substitute.

If participating in this personal and private time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament is of interest to you, please let us know.

There is no formality to private Eucharistic Adoration. Pray the Rosary or your favorite prayers, read scripture, talk to the Lord and share your burdens or your joys, or just sit in His presence and let Him speak to you in the silence.

If you cannot commit to one hour each week or being an occasional substitute, please feel free to stop in anytime during the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays; spend as little or as much time as you need with our Lord.

## Finding Him in the "Breaking of the Bread"

The Incarnation of the Word, the ineffable mystery of the merciful love of God, who so loved man that he became "flesh" for his salvation, is, in a way, prolonged and extended through the ages, and will be until the end of time, by the Eucharist, the Sacrament by means of which the Incarnate Word became himself our "food." God was not content with giving us his only Son once for all, willing him to take flesh in the womb of the Virgin-flesh like ours, so that he might suffer and die for us once on the cross-but he wished him to remain with us forever, perpetuating his real presence and his

sacrifice in the Eucharist.

The Eucharist makes the presence of Jesus with us a permanent one. In the consecrated host we find the same Jesus whom Mary brought into the world, the Jesus that called the apostles to follow him, died on the cross, that same Jesus that rose again, seated in glory at the right hand of the Father, who in union with the Father sends us the Holy Spirit. O Jesus, you are always with us, yesterday, and today, and the same forever!

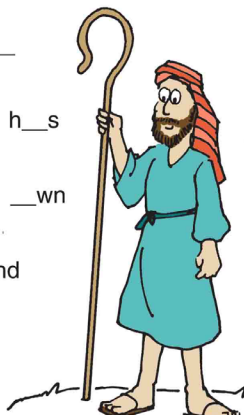
