We hear two key lines in the readings that shape our Connecting Point for this week: In the first reading from Acts, the apostles are told they will be Christ's witnesses to all the ends of the earth. It's not a request; it's not a suggestion; it's given to them as a statement of fact. The second, is the Great Commission that commands us to go and make disciples of all nations. If we put these together, we understand our role is to continue the work Christ confided in us, to extend the Kingdom of God throughout the world.

Ok, cool, but what does that mean? Embracing The Great Commission means taking the Good News to the people. So often I listen to people complain about how people aren't coming back to church the way they used to, and they continue asking questions like, "what can we do to get people back in the pews?" But the Great Commission does not say "figure out ways to get people to come to you." Rather, it begins with the simplest word, go.

Let's make a more concerted effort to show love, compassion, kindness, and patience in every encounter, text message, email, and social media comment. In doing so, we put ourselves on the path to becoming better disciples and witnesses of Christ and his teachings.



"Pentecost is a Christian holiday which takes place on the 50th day after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles." (Wikipedia)

Pentecost Sunday is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church.

The Acts of the Apostles recounts the story of the original Pentecost as well (Acts 2). Jews from all over were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish feast. On that Sunday, the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary were gathered in the upper room, where they had seen Christ after his resurrection:

Christ had promised his Apostles that he would sent his Holy Spirit, and, on Pentecost, they were granted the gifts of the Spirit. The Apostles began to preach the Gospel in all of the languages that the Jews, who

And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them: And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with diverse tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak.

Acts 2:2-4

were gathered there, spoke, and about 3,000 people were converted and baptized that day.

That is why Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the new covenant is inaugurated. It's interesting to note that St. Peter, the first pope, was already the leader and spokesman for the Apostles on Pentecost Sunday.

As part of our Pentecost celebration this year, we will sing the Entrance Antiphon for our extended entrance procession. The ministers will begin from the Holy Spirit wing of the church and process through the aisles of the church, symbolizing the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church.


The K of C Council 7200 thanks Fr. Ron and the church for their support during the 2023 Fish Fry and looks forward to next year when we once again plan on full operations.
