In today's Gospel, on the first Easter, Jesus greets his apostles and offers them the gift of perfect peace. He then breathes on them and says "Receive the Holy Spirit." The peace Jesus offers is a passion and zest for life, amidst the chaos of the world. Jesus doesn't promise to stop the chaos, but to give us calm and peace amidst the chaos. So

how do I allow the Spirit to fill me with this peace?"

I believe the first step is to recognize our thirst for the Holy Spirit. In attempting to find meaning and joy in life, we tend to fill the emptiness within us with things of this world, such as: material objects, power, success,

relationships, etc. None of these give us lasting peace. How many truly peaceful, joy-filled people do you know? Just as our minds thirst for knowledge, our souls thirst for the Holy Spirit. Our souls thirst for the calm and peace that only the Spirit of Jesus can give us.

Feel the thirst, then join the

▶ Connecting Point (cont'd)

Christian community in prayer! In both the Acts of the Apostles' account of the first Pentecost, and today's Gospel, the apostles are gathered together in prayer. It is primarily through the gathered community that the Holy Spirit is given us, principally as we celebrate Mass. It is particularly at the times of silence during Mass, especially following the readings of sacred scripture, and after receiving Holy Communion, that we allow the Holy Spirit to fill us with peace. We immerse ourselves in silence during these moments. Praising God,

especially by singing sacred music, also opens us to receive the Holy Spirit.

What else? Pray daily. The Holy Spirit also comes to us in contemplative or centering prayer. We empty ourselves in order to allow the Holy Spirit to fill us. Properly prayed, the rosary is a good form of contemplative prayer. If you google "contemplative prayer" or "centering prayer," you will find how to practice these prayer forms.

In today's scripture readings, the Holy Spirit turns the apostles' fear, (they had locked the doors of the place where they were staying out of fear), into the joy of experiencing the peace that only Jesus can give. Quenching our soul's thirst for the Spirit will fill us with that peace.

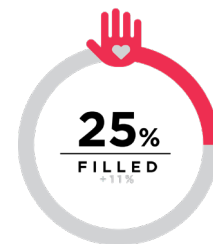

The patch will be up until the weekend before the festival. Please check the board each week. Berries will be added weekly!



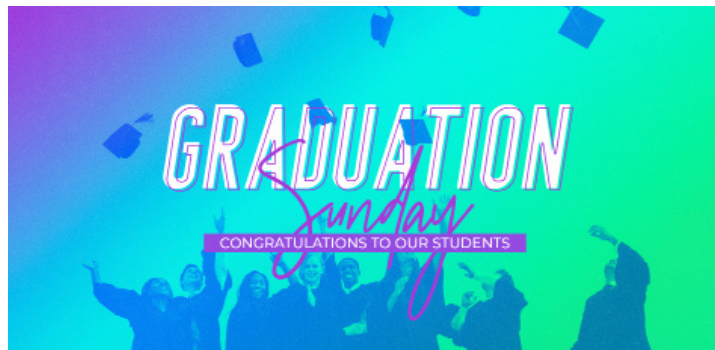
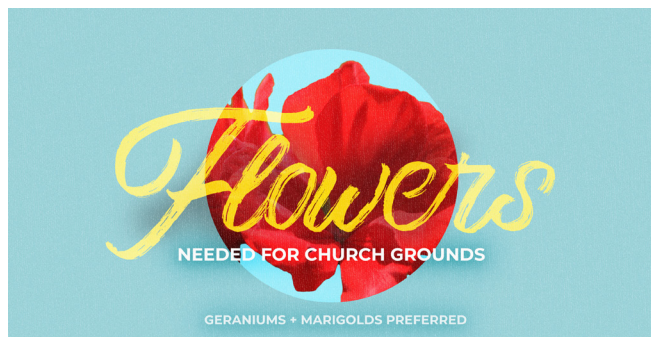

▶ Weekly Eucharistic Adoration



In a world where there is so much noise, so much bewilderment, there is a need for silent adoration of Jesus concealed in the Host... It is a source of comfort and light, particularly to those who are suffering.

The exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is offered every Tuesday at St. Isidore in the Resource Center immediately following 8:00 AM Mass and concludes with Benediction at 4:15 PM. The Resource Center is located the first door to the right as you enter the Church from the Mary's Garden Entrance on the Romeo Plank side of the Church.

We are in need of additional regular weekly coverage for the hours of 12:30-1:30 and 2:30-3:30. We also

need additional people who can serve as an occasional substitute. If participating in this personal and private time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament is of interest to you, please let us know.

There is no formality to private Eucharistic Adoration. Pray the Rosary or your favorite prayers, read scripture, talk to the Lord and share your burdens or your joys, or just sit in His presence and let Him speak to you in the silence.

If you cannot commit to one hour each week or being an occasional substitute, please feel free to stop in anytime during the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays; spend as little or as much time as you need with our Lord.

Would you like your life to change forever, in a good way? Oddly enough, not many people have stepped out of their comfort zone to venture into this ministry. Recipients are usually very open and accommodating unless they have doctors visits, therapy, etc., that dictate their schedule.

Remember we are all part of the priestly ministry of Jesus, our great High Priest. Your visiting with the homebound and bringing them Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, along with bringing yourself in Jesus' caring way, is a blessing for both of you.

This year we will have our Corpus Christi Procession on Sunday, Jun 11, following the 11:30 Mass.

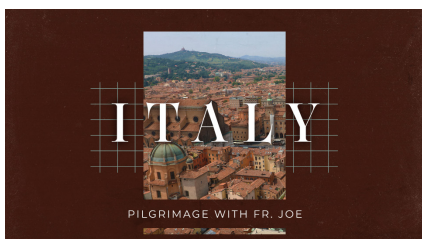
