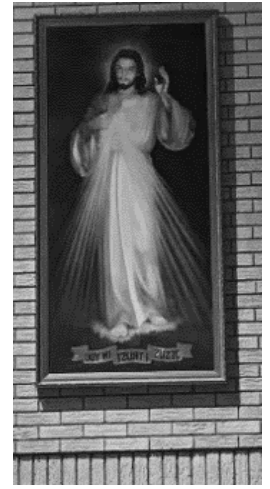

MASS REFLECTION TEACHING POINTS

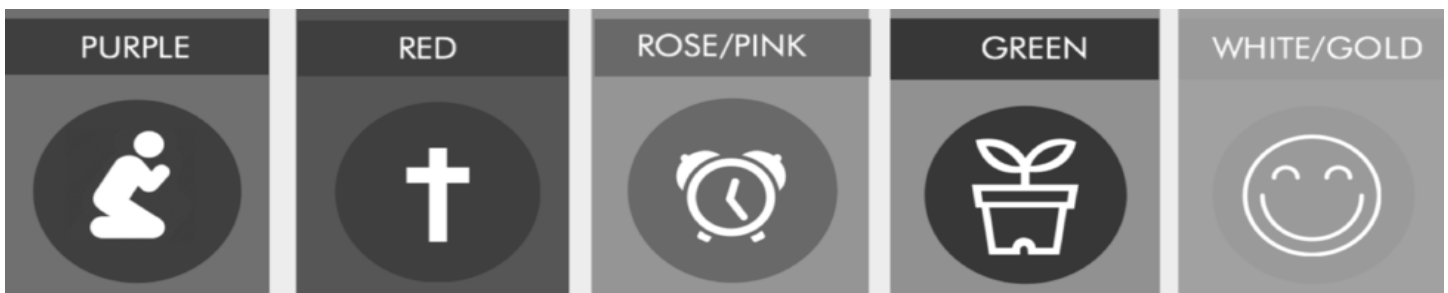


This week we'll learn about . . . The Divine Mercy (TDM)

- The picture of Jesus in his role of "The Divine Mercy," at St. Isidore, is located within the music area over the Reconciliation Room door.
- This picture is based on a vision that St. Faustina Kowalska had of Jesus in 1931. In her vision, she was instructed by Jesus to have this image painted.
- The image of The Divine Mercy is located over the Reconciliation Room door because Jesus gave us the message that his mercy is greater than our sins.
- In the picture, two beautiful rays of light pour out from Jesus' heart to represent his mercy.
 - The blue ray represents the water used in the Sacrament of Baptism
 - The red ray represents the blood "which is the life of souls," most especially in the Eucharist
- Divine Mercy Sunday is always the first Sunday after Easter:
 - Jesus wanted us to know: "Through the Word Incarnate, I make known the bottomless depth of my mercy."
- The message of The Divine Mercy is simple: God loves us – all of us.
