How oppressed, afflicted, or anxious are you? How blessed are you? Does it depend on what type of day you are having? Or does it depend on your attitude and/or how much love you have in your heart?

There is no joy without love, and true joy is rooted in love. The amazing love Christ showed for us on the

cross defies any trial we will ever face. I remind myself frequently, while at Mass, by praying at the crucifix and trying to imagine what Jesus went through for us.

“Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God and

kiss your children, pamper your parents, to live poetic moments with friends, even when they hurt us.”






▶ Adoration 101
