turn away from him, we lose vigilance and become unprepared to receive Jesus when he comes again. This is the same warning he gives in the Gospel this week, where the man traveling abroad leaves his servants in charge of his home and orders a watch at the gate. We are the servants of his Church, which he left in our care. We are entrusted with continuing his work and have been given the gifts of the Holy Spirit to do so.

Advent lets us refocus where we are in our readiness and turn back to

the Lord so we can be prepared for the season of his return. How can we do this? Eucharistic Adoration is a beautiful time to sit before the Lord and be with him. We move away from the many distractions in our lives and focus on what he tells us in our hearts. We feel the movements of the Spirit within us. We can use our gifts to volunteer at our parishes and serve the community. This service could be with the Knights of Columbus, Altar Society, Ushers, Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, or other ministries that support our

community. If we have not been to confession in a while, we can turn back to pray for forgiveness. If we haven't attended Mass very often, we can resolve to attend weekend Mass. The critical thing to remember is the Lord wants us to return to him with open arms. No matter where we are in our faith lives, Jesus always meets us where we are now. So, we have an opportunity in the weeks of Advent to ask ourselves: What will it take for me to return to Jesus so I am prepared?





## Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

A common misconception is that the Immaculate Conception occurred when Jesus was conceived in Mary's womb. The Immaculate Conception actually celebrates the conception of Mary in the womb of her mother, St. Anne. The misconception could be due, at least in part, to the Gospel reading heard on the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Luke 1:26-38 includes the dialogue between Mary and the angel Gabriel at the time of the conception of Jesus.

Although there are no Gospels that go back to the time of Mary's own conception and birth, we certainly honor her as the greatest of Saints and as the recipient of the holiest gifts of God's grace. These gifts and her consequent holiness were bestowed on her by the father to honor his Son, who was incarnate through her. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines the Immaculate Conception as: The dogma proclaimed in Christian Tradition and defined in 1854, that from the first moment of her conception, Mary – by the singular grace of God and by the virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ – was preserved immune from original sin (491).

The proclaimed Roman Catholic dogma states "that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin".[1] Being always free from original sin, she was from the start filled with the sanctifying grace that would normally come with baptism after birth. Although widelyheld since at least Late Antiquity, the doctrine was not formally proclaimed until Pope Pius IX did so in 1854 in *Ineffabilis Deus*.

We give thanks for our Blessed Mother Mary, for her courage, acceptance, and witness to God's Divine plan unfolding in her.


