Quite a few years ago, I had the privilege of hearing a reflection by Fr. Paul Berg on the star that led the magi to their encounter with the baby Jesus. He explained that we usually think of the star cosmically-as the brightest amongst those in the night sky. Instead, he encouraged us to think of the star relationally. Very rarely, if ever, are we guided by the cosmos. Most often, we are guided by people. People lead us through and out of our darkest times, keeping us steady on the right path. People lead us to Christ.

This Epiphany, let's spend a little time reflecting on who has been a guiding

light in our lives. People can guide us by the advice they offer. However, I've been guided more often by the example of life that people around me offer. My sister, Celeste, and her husband, Eddie, exemplify this. They included me in many of their adventures when I was a teen, and I observed how they treated people

Celeste and Eddie welcomed them on the weekends, providing them with a loving and stable place of refuge during this turbulent time in their young lives. Alyza is now married with four children of her own, and lan just got engaged.

When Amie was in high school, one of her friends was kicked out of her house. Once again, Celeste and Eddie added another child to their family. They explained to Amie that if they invited Jackie to live with them, she would be a part of their family, regardless of what happened. Jackie was with them only three weeks before finding out she was pregnant. Nine months later, they welcomed little Mackenzie into the family. Over the next three years, they tried to help Jackie with addictions, parenting, etc. She became pregnant a second time, and after Jayden was born, Jackie left. They have raised

Mackenzie and Jayden on their own, helping them grow into loving and productive young ladies. They held true to their commitment when welcoming Jackie into their family.

Have my sister and brother-in-law lived perfect lives? No, they have had their struggles, just like the rest of us. However, their faithful love lived out for others inspires me to be a better disciple of Christ. We all have people who show us the way. Who are yours? How do they inspire you to live Christ's love in your life?

Meet St. Therese's Parish Nurse

I would like to take the opportunity to introduce myself. My name is Marilyn Cito, and I am a Parish Nurse at St. Therese of Lisieux. I have been a Registered Nurse for 48 years and bring a variety of experiences to my role at St. Therese. I graduated from Harper Hospital School of Nursing with a Diploma in Nursing, attended Wayne State University for a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Degree, and obtained a Masters of Arts in Education Degree. I am Board Certified in Holistic Nursing.

Over the years, I have worked at a number of hospitals and in a variety of roles, my last role being the Director of Education at Ascension St. John. I retired in 2018 and after 3 months of retirement, I decided I needed to continue my journey as a nurse. I was hired at St. Therese of Lisieux and feel blessed every day to have found such a wonderful new church family, in addition to being a parishioner at St. Isidore since 1988.

For those of you who are not familiar with the Health Ministry at St. Therese of Lisieux, we have 47 volunteers in our Health Ministry who help whenever there is a need. Some volunteers work a couple of times a year, while others work tirelessly. Our ministry performs a variety of activities including providing educational events to our parishioners and community, writing health related topics for our church bulletin, hosting health events such as administration of flu shots, blood drives, health screenings, and exercise classes. We also facilitate support groups like the MS support group and our Grief Support Series. We offer respite care and emotional support for our parishioners in need, and act as a resource to parishioners for referrals. Other programs include the Meals from the Heart Program, Intergenerational Program, and the Medical Lending Closet which provides equipment, supplies and nutritional supplements to people in need.

In 2021, the Archdiocese of Detroit's new parish governance model, Families of Parishes, was formed and St. Therese of Lisieux. St. Isidore and St. Francis-Maximilian were grouped together in North Macomb. Although there are many advantages to the Family of Parishes model, collaboration and sharing of resources is key. It is with this in mind, that St. Therese's Health Ministry would like to share some of our resources. Although St. Isidore has a Health Ministry in place, lead by Heather Herbst, we would like to extend an invitation to parishioners at St. Isidore and St. Francis-Maximilian to attend any of



our educational and health screening events, borrowing of equipment and supplies, participation in the Intergenerational Project, and support groups. We will also begin sharing Health Ministry articles from the St. Therese church bulletin in the St. Isidore church bulletin, as space permits.





Day of Prayer for the Protection of Unborn Children

On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton*. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion.

On June 24, 2022, the *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* decision overturned Roe v. Wade, and we praise God for the great opportunity state and federal legislators now have to protect preborn children. While God, in His mercy, ended the nearly fifty-year nationwide regime of abortion on demand, right now state and federal laws, in many instances, are still hostile to preborn children. So, great prayer and advocacy is very needed.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "**Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children**." The Church directs:

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/ or almsgiving. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops provides resources to help parishes, schools, families, ministries, and individual Catholics participate in this important day of prayer and penance.

In addition, the USCCB also sponsors an annual, nationwide novena called **9 Days for Life**, which encompasses the liturgical observance of the Day of Prayer. Each day for nine days, a different intention is featured, accompanied by a short reflection, suggested actions, and related information as we pray for the respect and protection of every human life. Visit **respectlife.org/9-days-for-life** for more information on the annual campaign.

A sample timeline and activity, homily helps, announcements, and more are provided to help you get started. You are encouraged to adapt these resources as needed to fit your specific parish, school, or ministry.
