changes in one way or another. We also know how quickly one's life can change. As I write this article, news outlets are talking about the house explosion in Northfield Township, killing four family members, with the grandfather and grandson still in the hospital. Look how this sixteen-year-old young man's life changed in an instant. He lost both his parents and his two siblings. How does one even start to comprehend what his life will be like—combined with a long recovery from his physical injuries? In addition, we cannot forget the questions and potential guilt that the grandfather may be experiencing.

We hear these types of stories all the time, but do we acknowledge that they could happen to us? Or do we go about our lives thinking they only happen to other people? Life is much easier with the latter mentality, but it is also unrealistic to ourselves and others.

“Time is running out. What do I need to change?”

First, I need to put more effort into my daily prayer life and listen to what the Lord says to me. I get bored easily and have become very

lazy with my prayers. Although I still perform my morning prayers, they have become very ritualistic and stagnant. Unfortunately, my evening prayers have become nonexistent. I know from experience, however, that a good prayer life helps me get through life's challenges. I am a better person when I take the time to pray, and adopting this change will nourish my soul.

I also need to accept that interruptions are simply a part of life. As a planner, there are days when I have multiple things scheduled, only for a sudden phone call, text, or personal request, to change my day frustratingly. When these events occur, I must remember that my and God's plans are not always the same. Remembering that God is in control can be difficult, but his presence in a situation eases or, at least, deters my frustration.

For the people who know me, I tend to say, “Things will happen when they are supposed to happen.” While straightforward to tell others, I find it challenging to live by this statement concerning my own ambitions and desires. So, I must learn to forgive myself when I don't accomplish

things as planned. Again, once I put God in the picture, hopefully, forgiveness will follow.

I was fortunate to have various people in my life who helped me become a better person and a better Christian. On the Epiphany of the Lord, Fr. Chris explained in his homily that some people in our lives are similar to the guiding star that the magi followed to seek out Jesus, the newborn King. I need to take the time to connect with those special people to thank them for being my guiding stars and share my appreciation for their support. God put them in my life so I could become who I am today.

There are other changes I need to make in my life, but I know God still loves me despite all my imperfections. One final change would be to stop judging others and accept their imperfections, just like God does for me.

May we all have the courage to make the necessary changes in our lives so we can experience the constant love of God as we live the year of the Lord, 2024.

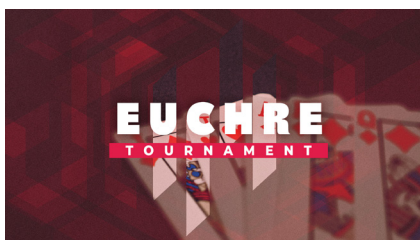

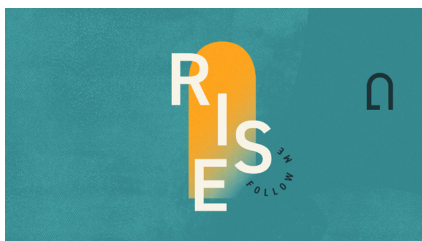

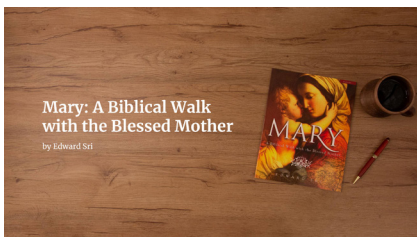

Are You Being Called to Funeral Home Ministry?

In the Catholic Church there are three parts to a funeral liturgy. The first part is the Vigil Service which takes place at the funeral home. This can be a scripture service or a scriptural Rosary. The Vigil Service is held the evening before the funeral and can be led by a priest, deacon, or lay person (non-ordained).

The second part is the Funeral Mass itself, or if requested a Funeral Service (outside of Mass). The Funeral Mass is celebrated by a priest and is almost always in the church. A Funeral Service is usually performed by a deacon and is almost always at the funeral home. In some circumstances, when a priest or deacon is not available, a lay person is permitted to lead a Funeral Service (this is not the norm in our Archdiocese).

The third part, the Committal Service,

takes place at the cemetery. This can be led by a priest, deacon, and in some cases, a lay person.

We have a wonderful team at St Isidore that graciously brings the love and comfort of Christ to those families through this ministry. However, we need additional volunteers for the Vigil Service at the funeral home. They arrive about 15 minutes prior to the start of the service, meet with the family, and then with the assistance of funeral home personnel, begin the service. Typically, the amount of time spent at the funeral home is approximately 45 minutes. Each Funeral Home Minister has a copy of the approved Scripture Service and Scriptural Rosary to use in leading the mourners in prayer.

Training is a must before anyone is asked to lead either service. The training is less than two hours long.

Last year we had 109 funerals at St. Isidore. Since December we've had 11 funerals. We have seven lay Funeral Home Ministers available to assist with Vigil Services. There are times when even seven Funeral Home Ministers is not enough to handle our needs. If you are comfortable speaking and praying with groups of people, and also feel comfortable speaking with grieving families, then I ask you to consider volunteering to be a Funeral Home Minister.

▶ Calling All High Schoolers - Teen Home Repair Mission Trip

This mission trip focuses on home repairs for elderly, disabled, or financially challenged families. Hundreds of teenagers from youth groups across the country will repair and transform homes while deepening their faith and building new relationships with their peers and youth leaders. This mission will have up to 400 teenage participants that focus specifically on residential home repair. The types of home repair projects range from painting, to building decks and wheelchair ramps, and other general home repairs. But, the service projects often are secondary to the spiritual

growth that happens when teenagers step out of their own worlds and serve those in need. Beyond the physical transformation that happens in communities, teenagers bring the hope and light of Jesus to the residents they serve.

During a home repair mission trip, participants generally stay at a local school. These stays are full of fun and energy throughout the week as they engage in indoor and outdoor games, share meals together, and participate in worship and teaching in morning and evening programs. This year we'll be going to Midland

Michigan, July 21-27.

If there's a teenager, college student, or adult in your family that would like to learn these skills, benefit from personal and spiritual growth, lead others, build out a resume, or just have fun helping others and expressing their faith, please join me and those that have already committed to go.

We have spots available and for those interested, there are scholarships and fundraising opportunities beginning in late January.

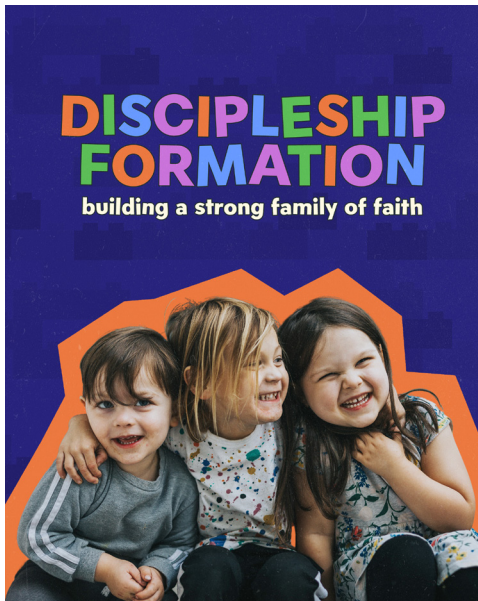


► Fleece Donations Needed

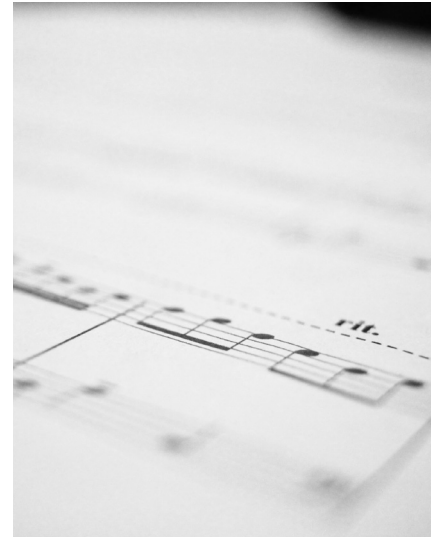
▶ A New Song for Eucharistic Revival

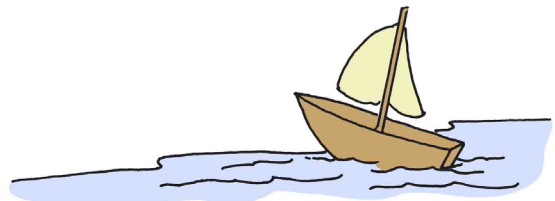
