moments are the challenges that can threaten our Gospel living. To stay focused, I try to live with the following in mind:

- Faith over fear.
- Active and attentive listening. (Listen more, talk less.)
- Forgiveness over hurt.
- Joy over jealousy.

Yes, I sometimes get caught up in my selfishness and fail to "check all boxes" on the list. But being part of a faith community, attending Mass, and receiving the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Reconciliation gives me strength for Gospel living that I would not otherwise have on my own.

On a more personal note, I am genuinely inspired by the love witnessed and shared in communion at St. Isidore. During Mass, I am often reminded of how God's great love is shared in even the simple and mundane of our daily lives, in both ordinary and extraordinary moments, and in our being Christ to one another. We all share the Good News by living faithfully in the light of the Lord. Go, team! Recently, I heard someone say, "church is not the place you go; it's the place you go from."

We go forth to discover a renewed way of living and being in the Holy Spirit.

Ash Wednesday and Lenten Practices

Amy Righi amy@stisidore.church Ash Wednesday is always observed on the Wednesday that falls seven weeks prior to Easter. This Day of Repentance is a Christian observance which represents the first day of Lent and the start of approximately six weeks of fasting and penance.


A solemn reminder of our sinfulness and mortality, Ash Wednesday calls us to repentance. We are marked with the sign of the Cross with Ashes on our foreheads as a reminder of our own sinfulness and need for repentance.

Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel.

Fasting and Abstinence

The Church emphasizes the penitential nature of Ash Wednesday by calling us to fast and abstain from meat. Catholics who are over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast, which means that we can eat only one complete meal and two smaller meals (not to equal a regular meal) with no food in between. Catholics over the age of 14 are also required to abstain from eating any meat on Ash Wednesday. (This fast is also prescribed for Good Friday.)

Fasting and abstinence is not simply a visual form of penance, it is also a call for us to focus on prayer and our spiritual lives. As Lent begins, we are encouraged to set out specific spiritual goals we would like to reach before Easter and decide how we will pursue them. Other suggestions to enhance our Lenten experience could include a donation of time or money to a charity, setting aside more time each day for prayer and/or reading scripture, helping a neighbor in need, attending Mass, or going to confession more often.

Did You Know? Protect Human Life

A doctor advised St. John Paul II's mother to abort the future pope, as the birth threatened her own life.

St. John Paul II was a vocal advocate throughout his papacy for the protection of all human life, from conception until natural death. He defended mothers and their children, urging them to choose life.

Emilia Wojtyla's pregnancy was difficult, and it threatened her life. Her first doctor firmly believed that if she went through with the birth she would die, insisting that she have an abortion. However, Emilia did not want to kill her own child and instead switched doctors. Her new doctor advised her to lie down and conserve her strength. She also entrusted herself to the Virgin Mary during the pregnancy. She was able to deliver St. John Paul II on May 18, 1920, and also survived the process.

Unfortunately, she would die nine years later of nephritis, leaving the future Pope a heavy cross to bear as a young child, losing his mother. He was deeply impacted by the choice of his mother and did what he could to support mothers in crisis pregnancies. (Aletia Premium, Philip Kosloski)
