It is no coincidence that Lent occurs close to the beginning of Spring. Typically, people engage in spring cleaning by clearing out the garage or basement, changing the décor, or going through closets and getting rid of the clutter. In more ways than one, Lent is a type of spiritual spring cleaning. We need to clear out those

things that clutter our hearts and minds to make room for God.

Our consciences often cause us to hold on to past hurts and memories, which prevent us from fully embracing God. As we enter this season of Lent, now is the time to "appeal to God for a clear

conscience," as Peter tells us in today's second reading. But what do we need to do to make that happen?

Remember the acronym CAC: Complain about it, Accept it, or Change it. The past is in the past. We cannot change what happened, but we can change our responses. We

FR. RON'S *Reflections*

► Fr. Ron's Reflections

I am glad to return to writing (mostly) weekly articles for the Harvest News. It is an attempt to keep in touch with parishioners.

One of the blessings that came with my accident two years ago was the opportunity for Fr. Joe Dailey to preside at our weekend liturgies. As you have experienced, Fr. Joe is an excellent liturgist and powerful preacher. As a Senior Priest, and former pastor of Christ the Redeemer Parish in Lake Orion, Fr. Joe was available to assist us immediately following my accident two years ago. I am very grateful for his ministry here. Because Fr. Joe presides at either the 7:30 and 9:30, or 9:30 and 11:30 liturgies, I very seldom pray with the 9:30 Mass group! (I preside at whatever morning Mass he doesn't preside at

on a Sunday, and the 5:30 evening Mass.).

Also, following Fr. Matt Ellis' departure from our parish in June, 2022, Msgr. Mike Hrydziuszko, Pastor of St. Isidore from 2000 to 2012, and now a Senior Priest, has returned to preside regularly at the 4:30 Saturday evening Mass. Parishioners are very happy to have Msgr. Mike back "home," and appreciate his presence, liturgies, and preaching. I am grateful to Msgr. Mike for his assistance, and for the way he pastored the parish prior to my arrival.

We continue to move forward in our transition to the Family of Parishes. We have benefited from sharing ministry with the people of St. Francis/St., Maximilian and

St. Therese Parishes. I am using the Lenten Prayer Journal the FOP Leadership Team and Pastoral Council have provided us. It is a great way to enter into the Lenten disciplines.

I hope to see you at the Knights of Columbus Lenten Fish Fries on Friday evenings. It is an opportunity to connect with the community and support the Knights and their charitable work.

I remind you to keep our Catechumens and Candidates for Full Communion in the Catholic Church in your prayers as they prepare to celebrate the Easter Sacraments at the Easter Vigil.

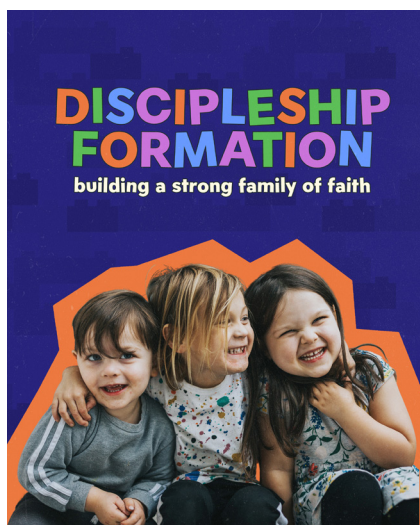
cannot keep reliving what happened and complain about it, hoping for a different result. We could accept it and say, "Well, this is the way it is," and remain frustrated and perhaps even miserable. Or, we learn from our experiences to move forward and change our attitudes and outlooks. To really clear our consciences, we need to let things go and let God take their place. For example, if I am overweight, I can complain that I am overweight, and nothing will change. I can accept that I am overweight and maybe be miserable because I don't see any way out. Or, I could make a plan to lose weight by replacing my fat intake with exercise—getting rid of the negative mindset and developing a more positive outlook on life. In effect, I clear my conscience of negativity and self-criticism and adopt an attitude of

seeing God's presence around me.

Whatever you are guilty of (e.g., gossip, stealing, infidelity, alcoholism, drug use, criticism, poor attitude, filling in your sin, or addictive behavior), you have the power to change it with God's help. As Jiminy Cricket said, "Our conscience is our guide," but it's more than that. Our consciences are moral barometers that keep us on the path to righteousness. When something bothers us, it is God's way of telling us that something isn't quite right in our lives.

If I truly want to be free this Lent, I need to look at what is bothering me (i.e., what is nagging at my conscience) and find ways to clear it. We learned in science class that nature abhors vacuums, and so in

clearing our consciences (letting go of the things that bother us, that is), we need to replace them with the presence of God. As St. Paul tells us, "Where sin abounds, grace even more abounds." It sounds oxymoronic, but in filling our hearts, minds, and lives with the presence of God, we, in effect, clear our consciences. So this Lent, empty and cleanse yourself by filling yourself up with God and his grace.

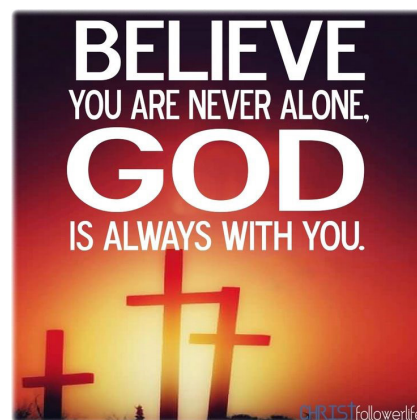

THE MESSAGE

The Message of Divine Mercy is that God is merciful. He is love itself poured out for us, and He wants no one to escape that merciful love. The message is that God wants us to turn to Him with trust and repentance while it is still a time of mercy, before He comes as a just Judge. This turning with trust to Him who is Mercy itself is the only source for peace for mankind. Turning to and imploring God's mercy is the answer to the troubled world.

His mercy is always available to us, no matter what we have done or what state we are in, even if our sins are as black as night, and we are filled with fears and anxieties. "The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to my mercy." Jesus' words to St. Faustina (Diary 723).

OUR RESPONSE

Not only are we to receive His mercy, but we are to use it, by being merciful to others by our actions, by our words, and by our prayers;

in other words by practicing the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy.

"Blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy" (Mt5:7). When He comes again, He will judge us on our mercy towards one another: "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt25:40).

▶ Reconciliation: An Opportunity

There are many great reasons to take advantage of the opportunity for Confession.

Confession is a Holy Sacrament of the Catholic Church through which we seek forgiveness for our sins. We name our sins, claim them, and ask forgiveness so that we can be spiritually cleansed and begin anew.

Sin separates us from God. Through Confession, we reconcile with God by acknowledging our faults and seeking forgiveness.

Admitting our sins to the priest fosters a sense of accountability for our actions. This accountability can help us grow in determination and moral improvement. Oftentimes, the priest may offer guidance and advice on how to avoid the sin in the future

and how to grow in our spirituality.

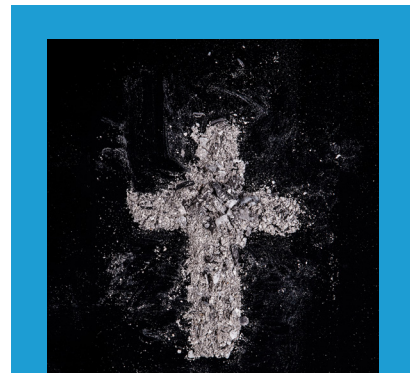
► Power in Prayer

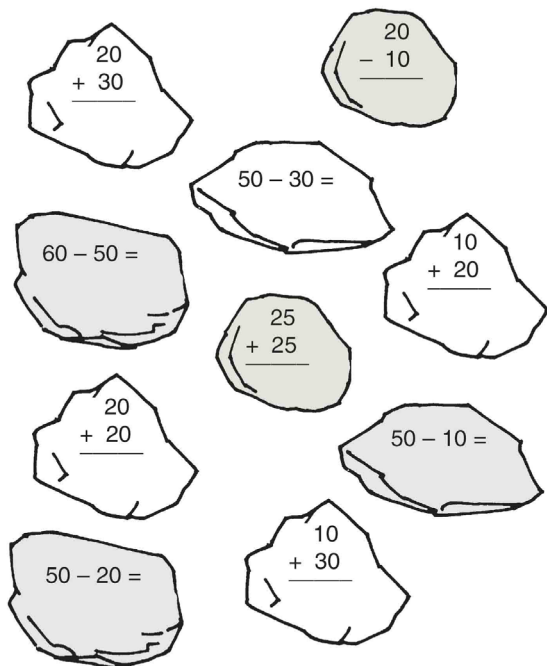

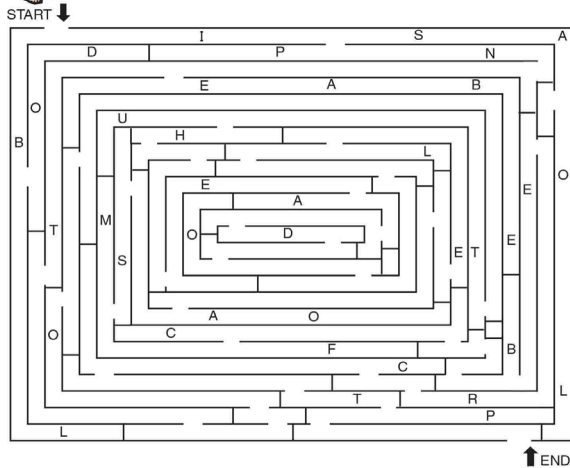

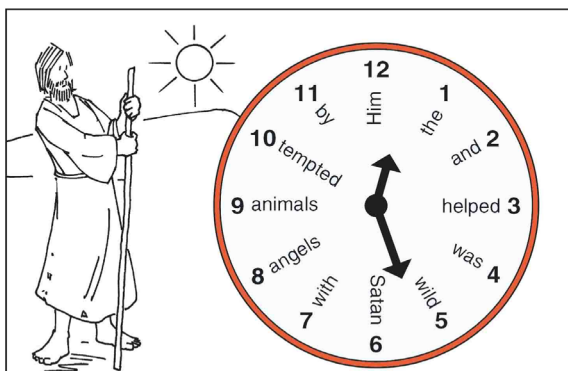
