The first words we hear this Sunday in the Liturgy of the Word are "God put Abraham to the test." This week's Connecting Point, and Lent in general, are God putting each one of us to the test, but, unlike Abraham, we get to choose the test.

God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son. As a parent, it's impossible to

fathom Abraham's courage and trust in God to be willing to do this. As a parent, I would do anything to save my child, including sacrificing myself, as I am sure most parents would agree.

While not quite on the same level, each Lent, most Catholics look for something to give up (i.e., sacrifice) for the duration of the season as a form of fasting. It is often a small pleasure or indulgence, but it is a sacrifice for us, nonetheless. Like me, you may choose the same sacrifice each year, but this Sunday's Connecting Point asks us to rethink our fasts.

As we continue this season of Lent, we are reminded that Lent is a community experience. Our focus as a parish is on the Catechumens and Candidates for Full Communion as they prepare for the Easter Sacraments, and on our parish, that we may be purified to receive new members.

Our Family of Parishes Lenten Journal is one way of connecting with members of our three parishes, as we all share this prayer form together. The reason we are called to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent is that we do this penance together, with our fellow parishioners and Catholics throughout the world. To eat meat on Friday is not so much a "sin" against God as it is a "sin" against the community, as it cuts off from the community. And cutting ourselves off from the community is cutting ourselves off from God.

We encourage you to join the

community in other ways this Lent: participating in weekend and daily Mass; joining us for the Stations of the Cross; participating in our Lenten Giving Tree; and coming together with the community at our Friday Fish Fry.

Lent is a time for both personal and communal renewal. Let's keep both in mind and in prayer.

sacrifice, but what God calls us to sacrifice. Each reading this Sunday involves listening to God, which is how we can differentiate those two ideas. To learn what God was calling him to do, Abraham had to listen. Then, in the Gospel, when Jesus and his disciples went up the mountain, God told the disciples to listen to Jesus.

We know that we need to listen, but

sometimes, we only hear what we want to hear and block out the rest. If you are fasting from a small pleasure or indulgence, it's not too late to stop, listen to God, and pray on what may be a more meaningful sacrifice on your Lenten journey. True sacrifice allows us to be imitators of Christ, thereby sharing in his suffering, fostering a deeper connection with Jesus, and acknowledging his sacrifice for our sins. Overall, the sacrifice of fasting during Lent is not just about abstaining from food or certain pleasures; it's a holistic spiritual practice designed to bring us closer to God and better prepare us to celebrate his Resurrection at Easter. So, what are you going to sacrifice from this point forward?



Divine Mercy Image

During the 1930's, Jesus revealed himself to Sister Faustina, a simple and holy nun, in Poland. He called her to be his secretary and his apostle of mercy. He spoke to her of his mercy and the way he wants us to respond to it. Through Sr. Faustina, Our Lord gave us special means of drawing on his mercy. They are a Feast of Divine Mercy, an Image of the Divine Mercy, a Novena, a Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and a 3:00 Hour of Divine Mercy, the hour of His death.

Jesus appeared to Sr. Faustina and told her to have the image painted according to the pattern that she saw before her. In the image, the glorified Jesus comes forth from the darkness, his right hand raised in blessing and left foot stepping forward in search of lost sheep. From Jesus' sacred body emanates blood (red ray) and water (pale ray). These two rays defeat Satan's only two weapons: sin and death. The cleansing waters of Baptism and the healing words of Confession wipe away sin. Death is wiped away by life - and life to the Jews was in the blood. Blood provides us life, so we receive Jesus' body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist. These rays represent what Christ asks us to do on the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday (April 7th this year), go to Confession and receive Holy Communion. You will find this image in St. Isidore Church on the wall above the confessional.

Jesus said, "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of Mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature, 'Jesus, I trust in You.' By means of this image, I shall grant many graces to souls." (Diary 327 & 742)

Reconciliation: An Opportunity

There are many great reasons to take advantage of the opportunity for Confession.

Confession is a Holy Sacrament of the Catholic Church through which we seek forgiveness for our sins. We name our sins, claim them, and ask forgiveness so that we can be spiritually cleansed and begin anew.

Sin separates us from God. Through Confession, we reconcile with God by acknowledging our faults and seeking forgiveness. Admitting our sins to the priest fosters a sense of accountability for our actions. This accountability can help us grow in determination and moral improvement. Oftentimes, the priest may offer guidance and advice on how to avoid the sin in the future and how to grow in our spirituality.




