CONNECTING POINT

How many times have we found ourselves bargaining with God?
Bargaining is a natural emotional response and instinct in our culture.
As consumers, we exchange money or influence to get what we want.
This routine makes it easy for us to try and react the same way in prayer with God.

We have all experienced times when we desired stability in finances, health, family, work status, independence, and order in our lives. Our mode of operating with each other to try and secure these things can sometimes lead us astray from God's will for us.

The first reading reminds us of

the Ten Commandments our Lord has given to guide us in the right relationship with him. Reminding ourselves of this fact helps us to recall that our relationship with God is covenantal. Often, we bend Jesus' teachings to make him the "Buddy Jesus" of our own choosing rather than the Jesus that God sent! Our bargaining ways do not fit the box

This weekend, we welcome Fr.
Robert Nalley to St. Isidore. Fr. Nalley is representing Food for the Poor.
Please extend a warm welcome to him, and please do what you can to support the good work of Food for the Poor.

Just over a year ago, we announced two significant projects to enhance our worship space and experience. The first, completed during Lent of last year, was the renovation of our baptismal font, including the addition of a sacred sculpture. Parishioner, Kurt Klein, wanted to create a sculpture that could not simply be found in a catalog. As a result, he crafted a beautiful and inspiring piece (and accompanying artwork) including Jesus, Mother Mary, and John the Baptist - a unique combination of figures. Parishioner Dominic Serra oversaw the replacement of the font's tiling, refurbishment of the brick and stonework, and new plumbing and electrical work. The font should be a major focus of our gatherings, as it is placed at the entrance to the worship space, thereby reminding us how it is through Baptism that we become members of the worshiping community. We extend tremendous gratitude to Kurt, Dominic, and his crew for donating their labor, as well as to the Altar Society for funding the materials.

The second project entails replacing the sanctuary's furnishings. I am told that when our church building was renovated twenty years ago, Msgr. Mike Hrydziuszko was forced to delay purchasing new furniture to avoid increasing the already substantial renovation expense. As you may have noticed, none of the furnishings match, and the carpeting beneath them is well-worn! Contemporary furnishings have been designed and built, including a new altar, ambo, tabernacle stand, credence table, candle stands, cantor lectern, and presider and deacon chairs. They are beautiful and, combined with the new carpeting on order, will give our sanctuary a cohesive, fresh look to help enhance our worship experience. These will all be installed later this spring or in the summer. We are waiting to make arrangements to remove the current altar - a major project in its own right. In addition, it is a Church requirement that the first Mass using a new altar be presided over by the local Bishop. For our diocese, Archbishop Vigneron, as the archbishop, must consecrate the altar. We are waiting to learn when Archbishop Vigneron will be available. We are grateful to the very active and supportive parishioner Nancy Campbell, who, upon passing in July 2020, bequeathed a large sum of money to St. Isidore Parish

and earmarked it for the new furnishings, making this project possible. We also thank the Campbell family for their continued support of our parish and their active ministry.

Both of these projects will enhance our worship, and due to the generosity of the benefactors mentioned above, neither was financed through parish funds.





we try to put him in, for God doesn't work as we do.

So, we are reminded that, as the Lord flipped tables over in the temple for a return to proper praise and worship with God, we need to flip our human actions to reconnect ourselves to God. Our bodies are temples of the Lord. When we receive him at Mass, we become little tabernacles. As

we let him enter under our roofs, do we synergistically work with him to flip our lives? This Lenten season is a great time to reflect on this task to help us grow with Christ and prepare for his return. We can prepare ourselves for God's grace by worshipping at Mass and living the Church's sacramental life by attending the Stations of the Cross, praying, and working with our

Hand Arthritis

If you are over the age of 50, Caucasian, female, overweight, had hand injuries, or have relatives with arthritis, there is a good chance you may develop some arthritis in your hands.

Arthritis is a disease that attacks the tissues of the joints where the two bones meet, as well as the lining of the joint, or cartilage, which covers at the ends of the bones. As cartilage breaks down, the ends of the bones become exposed and rub against each other and wear away. Hand arthritis is common since there are so many joints in the hands.

Osteoarthritis is a degenerative arthritis and the most common type of arthritis. When this happens, the cartilage breaks down, the ends of the bones rub together and causes pain, stiffness, and loss of movement. Osteoarthritis commonly affects the wrists, the joint at the base of the thumb, and the middle and top joints of the finger.

Rheumatoid arthritis, is a long term inflammatory disease that causes the joints to swell, pain, stiffness, and loss of function. It is an autoimmune disease and destroys the cartilage at the end of the bones, and the bone itself. The joints lose their shape as tendons and ligaments around the bone weaken and stretch. Rheumatoid arthritis affects the small joints of the wrist, hands and fingers and usually affects the same joints on both sides of the body.

Psoriatic arthritis affects the skin and joints. Fingers become swollen with joint pain and morning stiffness. It is similar to rheumatoid arthritis but

may only involve several fingers.

Symptoms of hand arthritis include dull or burning joint pain after increased use, morning pain, stiffness of hands, or swollen joints. Chronic hand arthritis symptoms may include using hands differently, clicking when bending fingers, fingers that don't fully open or close, bony nodules on the middle joint of fingers, or enlarged and abnormally bent finger joints, which may impact performing everyday tasks.

Diagnosis of arthritis can be determined by examination and with x-rays which show loss of bone cartilage and formation of bone spurs. A blood test for rheumatoid factor and other markers can help make the diagnosis of rheumatoid arthritis.

Treatment will depend on the type of arthritis, stage of the disease, how may joints are affected, age, activity level, and if the affected hand is the dominant hand. Treatment options include splinting/bracing, medications, injections, therapy and other non-drug options and surgery. Splints /braces support and protect the joint, keep it in alignment, and lessen the strain. Consult with your physician or occupational therapist to guide with purchase of brace/splint.

Medications may be ordered by your healthcare provide to reduce joint pain and swelling, and in the case of rheumatoid or psoriatic arthritis, help to prevent joint damage. For osteoarthritis, acetaminophen or nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs can be used to relieve symptoms.

Speak with your doctor to discuss what medications are best.

Steroid injections are also used to help reduce inflammation and relieve pain. Injections are administered into the affected joint and can only be repeated a few times since they can weaken tendons and ligaments.

Other treatment options include strengthening and stretching exercises, hot and cold packs, rest, healthy eating, management of diabetes and cholesterol, losing weight if overweight, quitting smoking, and occupational therapy to instruct on self-help devices to assist with dressing and food preparation.

When nonsurgical treatments no longer provide relief and the cartilage has worn away, surgery may be an option. The type of surgery will be determined by your doctor based on your condition.






