CONNECTING POINT

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus announces his approaching death and says, "...unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Jesus must die to bring us abundant life. He then goes on to say that we, too, must die to ourselves or give our lives away (i.e., "hate" our lives) to

enter that abundant life. So, as Jesus gives his life away, what has to die in our hearts in order for us to follow him more closely?

The refrain in today's Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 51), "Create a clean heart in me, O God," may help us as we reflect on this question. In scripture, the opposite of a "clean" or "pure" heart is a "divided heart." A clean heart realizes that God is big and good enough to give our entire hearts to, as Jesus did in giving his life away. Perhaps what needs to die in our hearts is anything that keeps us from giving them to God and his ways.

ROAD TO EMMAUS SUMMIT



How often do we not recognize Jesus?

The Road to Emmaus story appears in Luke 24:13-35. It recounts an encounter between two disciples of Jesus who were traveling from Jerusalem to Emmaus on the day of Jesus' resurrection, although they did not yet realize that he had risen. As they walked, they discussed the events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion and the reports of his resurrection.

Suddenly, Jesus himself approached and began walking with them, but they did not recognize him. He asked them what they were discussing, and they explained their sadness over the crucifixion of Jesus and their confusion about reports of his resurrection. Jesus then interpreted the Scriptures for them, explaining how the Messiah had to suffer before entering his glory.

Upon reaching Emmaus, the disciples invited Jesus to stay with them, and as they shared a meal, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them. It was in this moment that their eyes were opened, and they recognized Jesus. However, he disappeared from their sight. How often do we not recognize Jesus in the people we cross paths with each day... In the events of our lives... In the beauty and wonder of creation... In the breaking of the bread at Mass... His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Divine Mercy Feast

On the Sunday after Easter, the entire Church is called to gather throughout the world to celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This Octave Day of Easter is a day chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces.

Our Lord asked Sister Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of the Divine Mercy on the Sunday after Easter, He told her: "On that day, the very depths of my mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that would go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary 699) In other words, our slate is wiped clean. How merciful is Our Lord!

To receive this grace, you simply need to go to Confession on the day of the feast or up to 20 days prior or after, be in a state of grace (no mortal sin), receive Holy Communion with the intention of obtaining the promised grace, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father (usually an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be). We should also do acts of mercy by forgiving and praying for others with the intention of being more merciful.

Please save the date for this celebration at St. Isidore Church on Sunday, April 7 starting at 1:30 PM.



You can take advantage of Reconciliation services at various parishes in March and April. In the next article we will review the Novena of Divine Mercy that begins on Good Friday.

Lenten Giving Tree

This week's article will focus on Cross Catholic Outreach's (CCO): Sorbelle Chapel/Parish Center Construction*

Description: Since 2019, CCO has partnered with the Diocese of Wa to aid and transform communities in need. This work has included education support and spiritual outreach, and this year CCO hopes to continue to strengthen the diocese mission by providing a new multi-purpose building for Mass, community gatherings, and adult education.

Purpose: To improve adult
education, facilitate religious
activities, and strengthen the
Churches evangelistic presence in a predominantly Muslim community.
Location: Sorbelle, a poor, rural area
of Sissala West District of Ghana's
Upper West Region, in the Diocese
of Wa.

Cost: As part of CCO \$984,503 commitment to community transformation the diocese of Wa,

\$178,684 is needed to help construct a chapel/parish center and sanitation block, and provide furniture and solar lights.

Highlights

Need: This small Catholic outstation is located in a very poor, rural area, where families are heavily dependent on the rainy season to grow the food they need for survival. The outstation currently has only one small mud brick structure for all its activities, limiting capacity and providing little protection from storms.

Impact: St. Isidore's financial support will ensure a more appropriate worship, learning, and meeting space for local Catholics and community members.

This upgrade will further the successful work of the local church in building bridges to the broader community, which has increasingly turned to the parish for needed social programs. Our generosity will set a wonderful example of Christ's love for all people and especially the poor.


