We begin the Mass of the Lord's Supper with the sign of the cross. The final blessing does not come until the end of the Easter Vigil. The three days are one great celebration of the Paschal Mystery. Please check the times of services and join us for as many as possible. We especially hope you can join us for the Easter Vigil, where we will be celebrating the Easter Sacraments of Initiation with ten Elect and ten Candidates for Full Communion with the Catholic Church. 
Divine Mercy Novena

A novena is nine days of prayer, in a row. Jesus taught St. Faustina a novena that he wanted her to pray. He asked that each day a different group of people be entrusted to Him. The starting date for the Novena along with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, is Good Friday. It ends on the Saturday after Easter Sunday. The following day is Divine Mercy Sunday. These special intentions include:

- Day 1 All mankind, especially all sinners
- Day 2 Souls of priests and religious
- Day 3 All devout and faithful souls
- Day 4 Those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know God
- Day 5 Those who have separated themselves from the Church
- Day 6 Meek and humble souls and the souls of little children
- Day 7 Souls who especially venerate and glorify God's mercy
- Day 8 Souls who are detained in Purgatory
- Day 9 Souls who have become lukewarm

Jesus' beautiful mercy reaches out to bring all souls into His Most Compassionate Heart through this novena. While you don't have to pray the novena to obtain graces on Divine Mercy Sunday, it is a good way to prepare. Jesus promised, "By this novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 796).

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord: March 25

The celebration of the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord commemorates the visit of the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the mother of our Savior. After giving her consent to God's word, Mary conceives Jesus in her womb and becomes the mother of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. God becomes incarnate in the womb of a woman, and "the Word became flesh" (John 1:14).

In modern times, this feast day has taken on special meaning in Respect Life ministry. Scientific advances have allowed us to confirm that life begins at conception. This solemnity helps us to recognize the gift of new life from its very beginning. It calls us to reflect on how we are to care for, protect, and welcome new life, as the Blessed Mother did for the Christ child. The Solemnity of the Annunciation also coincides with the anniversary of the papal encyclical Evangelium Vitae (The Gospel of Life). This Church teaching on the value and inviolability of every human life remains an indispensable source of truth for all people. Written by Pope St. John Paul II, Evangelium Vitae was appropriately given in Rome on March 25, 1995.

The encyclical highlights the importance of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Annunciation of the Lord in the Church's efforts to promote and defend human life:

> The angel's Annunciation to Mary is framed by these reassuring words: "Do not be afraid, Mary" and "with God nothing will be impossible" (Lk 1:30, 37). The whole of the

Virgin Mother's life is in fact pervaded by the certainty that God is near to her and that he accompanies her with his providential care.... Mary is a living word of comfort for the Church in her struggle against death. Showing us the Son, the Church assures us that in him the forces of death have already been defeated.1

focus from only wants and needs to the "good stuff" in our lives and helps strengthen our relationship with God.

In the second reading, Philippians 2:11, we hear, "...every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." When and how can we do this in our lives? Practically speaking, not everyone can stand on a street corner and shout this out at the top of their lungs. But we can live in ways that give such glory to the Father. During Lent, we fast, give alms, and spend more time in prayer at Mass and at home with family. Maybe we make it a point to attend the entire Triduum this year, which is a significant proclamation of faith.

In the Palm Sunday Gospel, we hear Peter deny Jesus. He had every good intention but failed under pressure. Can we truly confess Christ as our Lord and Savior in all social situations this year?

Lenten Giving Tree

This week's article will focus on Cross Catholic Outreach: Wells of Salvation - Quench Thirst in the Heart of Africa - Zambia and Malawi*

Description: The Wells of Salvation outreach enables parishes to forge a deeper connection with the global Catholic Church during Lent through the three pillars of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It offers a powerful opportunity to bless impoverished families in sub-Saharan Africa with clean water. In this way, we can unite Catholics through an inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's example.

Project Plan: Our almsgiving, will set in motion a series of steps resulting in safe, abundant water.

 Local committees nominate and visit villages to determine those most in need of clean, safe water. Typically, committee members include Church leaders and village chiefs who have a deep understanding of local needs.

- The land is surveyed to determine the ideal location for a community borehole.
- A professional crew drills the borehole to the proper depth so water will flow even during the dry season.
- Each village elects a committee to oversee the care and sustainability of their borehole, and families are trained in sanitation and hygiene practices.
- Families contribute a small amount financially to their community to cover any future maintenance needs. This ensures clean water will flow for many years to come.


Our contributions will do much more than provide a safe, reliable source of water. It will allow families to from

surviving to thriving - with improved health and more time for school, worship, and income-generating activities. The project plan includes supporting initiatives to improve nutrition, medical access, Catholic education, farming, microenterprise and spiritual formation - giving families the best opportunity to break the cycle of poverty.


