These words, from an historic
Negro spiritual, express the joy we
celebrate this Easter day! It rejoices
in the heart of our faith: God led
Jesus through suffering and death
on the cross to the glory of the
Resurrection. It is also our promise
of eternal life. Our physical death
is a transition to something much
better and more glorious! It is our
belief that in Baptism we died with
Christ so as to rise with him to new
life! We, too, shall rise!

We remind ourselves that Easter is not a day, it is a Season. The joy and new life of Easter is so abundant that it cannot be contained in just 24 hours. We celebrate the first eight days of Easter, the "Octave of Easter," as though it were still Easter day. And then we continue to celebrate for a total of fifty days.

Central to our Easter celebration was the celebration of the Easter Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) with our elect and candidates at the Easter Vigil. We welcomed twenty one new members into our worshiping community. During the Easter Season the newly baptized, now called "neophytes," will be wearing their white Baptismal garments to Mass. Please take time to welcome them, and keep them in your prayers.

We will also be celebrating First Communion with our young people during the Easter Season. Some of our young people will be celebrating their First Communion at our weekend liturgies. Since Eucharist is initiation into a worshiping community, it is good for the worshiping community to be present to welcome them! Other of our young people will celebrate their First Communion at traditional First Communion Masses. We ask our First Communicants to wear their First Communion clothes when they come to our weekend liturgies throughout the Easter Season. Please take time to welcome them and make a fuss over them!

We have so much to celebrate and rejoice in during this fifty-day Season of joy. Please join us throughout this season.








Connecting Point (cont'd)



How often do we not recognize Jesus?

The Road to Emmaus story appears in Luke 24:13-35. It recounts an encounter between two disciples of Jesus who were traveling from Jerusalem to Emmaus on the day of Jesus' resurrection, although they did not yet realize that he had risen. As they walked, they discussed the events surrounding Jesus' crucifixion and the reports of his resurrection.

Suddenly, Jesus himself approached and began walking with them, but they did not recognize him. He asked them what they were discussing, and they explained their sadness over the crucifixion of Jesus and their confusion about reports of his resurrection. Jesus then interpreted the Scriptures for them, explaining how the Messiah had to suffer before entering his glory.

Upon reaching Emmaus, the disciples invited Jesus to stay with them, and as they shared a meal, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them. It was in this moment that their eyes were opened, and they recognized Jesus. However, he disappeared from their sight.

How often do we not recognize Jesus in the people we cross paths with each day... In the events of our lives... In the beauty and wonder of creation... In the breaking of the bread at Mass... His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Sponsor Coordinator


Solicit local businesses for sponsorship opportunities.




LIGHT A BONFIRE




