In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus compares himself to a vine and his followers to branches, emphasizing that, just as branches can only bear fruit if they remain attached to the vine, believers can only live fruitfully if they maintain a close connection to him. This relationship is crucial for spiritual growth and achieving God's purposes. Every relationship has struggles: parent-child, child-parent, sibling, spousal, co-worker, and of course, one with God. Often, I struggle more in a relationship when I feel the person on the other end isn't doing their part or listening the way I'd like, and there are times when I feel less connected to God. My relationship with him struggles the most during hard times, like losing someone I loved, feeling like life is unfair, or enduring other challenges that didn't turn out how I'd hoped. In relationships, we often "punish" the other person by giving them the silent treatment or going out of our way to avoid them. Yet, avoiding our connections to God is *continued on page 8*

never the answer.

Remaining connected to God during struggles is the same as in any relationship: it involves showing humility in accepting the tension, showing accountability (because no relational struggle is ever one-sided), and listening first.

In my marriage, we have something called the "Forgiveness Cup," which was introduced and gifted to us. For the times we don't know what to say and are too afraid to be the first to admit we were wrong, we pour and share the cup as an olive branch.

So, in those times when you don't feel connected to God or don't think he is listening, remember, it's up to you (not him) to extend the spiritual Forgiveness Cup and open yourself up to listening to him and the greater plan that he has in store.



Eucharist: The True Presence of Christ



In this, our year of Eucharistic Revival, it is especially fitting for us to recall the awesome gift we have in the Eucharist. Every time we come to Mass, we are in the presence of the Lord, all the angels and saints. and we have the amazing privilege and honor to partake in the Body and Blood of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Eucharist is the True/Real Presence of Christ. At the last supper (1 Corinthians 11:24) Jesus said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Jesus said, "this is my body" not "this is a symbol of my body." We receive this most holy and spiritual food with the utmost respect and reverence. We bow before the Blessed Sacrament and acknowledge our faith in His Divine Presence in our resounding "Amen" as we receive the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Homebound Ministers

Eucharist is the source and summit

of all we do as Catholic Christians. Communion Ministers taking Eucharist to the homebound directly from Mass are entrusted with a powerful ministry of sharing the Body of Christ with the ill or infirm who are unable to join in the celebration of Mass. Prescribed



protocols are required for this special ministry including the use of a pyx to transport the consecrated Host. A pyx is a small round container specifically designed for the purpose of taking consecrated host to those unable to attend Mass due to illness or other afflictions.

Using any other means such as a tissue, handkerchief, or plastic bag to carry the Blessed Sacrament is prohibited.

*Homebound ministers, if you need to borrow a pyx, please see Father or the Deacon prior to Mass. Then you can receive the consecrated host by holding it open for the Minister of Communion at distribution.

We are grateful for the ministry of these homebound disciples willing to share prayer and Sacrament in this essential ministry of service. The graces we receive sharing in the Body and Blood of Christ are infinite and beyond human understanding. Jesus Christ, yesterday, today and forever. Soli Deo Gloria!
