As Deacon Rick and I were traveling to Mackinac Island for the Knights of Columbus State Convention, I remembered I hadn't yet written this Connecting Point article. Looking for inspiration on what to write about, the only thing that came to me that evening was that the Real Presence of Jesus means "everything" to me. But really, what does that mean?

The following day, Deacon and I had the opportunity to go to St. Anne Church and serve Mass. Afterward, we, along with a dozen other priests and about 200 Knights, prayed before the Blessed Sacrament and carried Jesus in procession through the streets to the Grand Hotel, where the convention would be held. The effect that Jesus' Real Presence had on those we passed,

both in the Blessed Sacrament and through the witness of over 200 people singing and praying in his honor, was miraculous. Every horse-drawn carriage stopped in reverence. People on the streets cleared a path for Jesus. Some made the sign of the cross, others fell to their knees, but all stopped their conversations to turn and gaze upon this spectacle of Living Faith. What an incredible

Today's feast of the Body and Blood of Christ celebrates the central role of the Eucharist in our Catholic Faith. Everything we do as a parish, especially in forming community and building up the Kingdom of God, flows to and from the Eucharist.

The Holy Eucharist, of course, is the true Body and Blood of Christ. We have to be careful. It is not the body and blood of Jesus. It is the body and blood of Christ who suffered

and died on the cross, rose from the dead, ascended into heaven, and sits at God's right hand. It is the entire Christ.

It is not appropriate to refer to the Eucharist, the consecrated host, as "Jesus." When we celebrate the Eucharist we celebrate the entire Paschal Mystery. We become one with the Risen and living Christ.

As a parish, it is our task to offer God

the best worship possible. The new altar furniture, which will be installed in two weeks, will help enrich our celebration of the Eucharist. The new altar will show how Christ gathers us around the table to nourish us spiritually, as he did for the apostles at the Last Supper. Christ gives us himself to heal us and give us strength.

Let's never take the Eucharist for granted!

► The Dedication of an Altar

The Mass for the Dedication of an Altar is a significant liturgical event in the Catholic Church. The Mass includes many additional rituals and symbols that highlight the importance of the altar as the central focus of worship where Eucharist is celebrated.

This Mass begins, as usual, with the Introductory Rites and the Liturgy of the Word. The scripture readings proclaimed on June 15 will be those prescribed for that weekend, the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time. (Yes, this "counts" for weekend Mass attendance.)

The Rite of Dedication of the Altar follows the Liturgy of the Word. Here are the distinctive rituals included in the dedication:

- Litany of the Saints: The Litany of the Saints invokes the intercession of the saints for the new altar and the community.
- Deposition of Relics: The relics of a saint are deposited and sealed within a special cavity in the altar.
- Prayer of Dedication: The Archbishop will recite the prayer of dedication, asking God to make the altar a place of worship and sacrifice.
- Anointing of the Altar: The Archbishop will anoint the altar with sacred chrism oil, making the sign of the cross on the surface. This sets the altar apart for sacred use.
- Incensation of the Altar: Incense is burned on the altar, symbolizing the prayers of the people rising to God.
- Covering and Lighting of the Altar: The chrism is wiped into the altar. (This will be done by Altar Society representatives, members of the Nancy Campbell family.) The altar is then covered with a special white cloth, and candles are lit to signify that Christ is the light of the world. The altar is dressed and ready for the celebration of the Eucharist.

Mass then continues with Communion and the Closing Rites as usual.

► Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus

The solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus (Corpus Christi) is a significant feast in the Roman Catholic Church, celebrated yearly, two weeks after Pentecost. This feast honors the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The bread and wine are transformed into the actual body and blood of Christ during every celebration of Mass.

In the Gospel verse for this weekend, Jesus says, *“I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.”* (Jn 6:51)

Going deeper into this same passage, we can see that many Christians today are not unlike the Jews of the time.

The Jews quarreled among

themselves, saying, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” Jesus said to them, “Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever.” (Jn. 6:52-58)

Jesus gives himself to us, to

everyone. He gives us himself in Eucharist and makes us able to pursue our journey toward Heaven, toward eternity. We partake of Christ's love in Holy Communion. Jesus himself is Eucharist: an anticipation of what we will live in eternity together.

The Eucharist gives us the experience of rediscovering the “Community,” and of “Encountering the community.” It is the laboratory of fraternity. This is why a Christian can never be content with personal prayer because there are times when the Community, Jesus's friends, gather together to pray. The ultimate gathering, source, and summit is Eucharist. In this gathering, we listen to the Word and nourish ourselves on the real presence of Christ.

experience to see how the Real Presence, honored in faith, can affect the world around us.

Both Deacon Rick and I had the honor of carrying Jesus in the procession, and we shared the same moving experience. The way the sunlight shone on Jesus' Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament caused us to see our faces reflected in the Holy Eucharist. Seeing myself in Jesus almost brought me to tears.

In becoming bread for me, he not only enters me through communion but also draws me into his very self to experience the depth of his peace, love, and joy. In that experience, I realized that being one with Jesus, living “Through him and with him and in him,” delivers very palpable peace, love, and joy. Coming only from him, that is the ultimate meaning of “Real Presence.” And for me, *that* is everything!

Family Time Fun Challenge

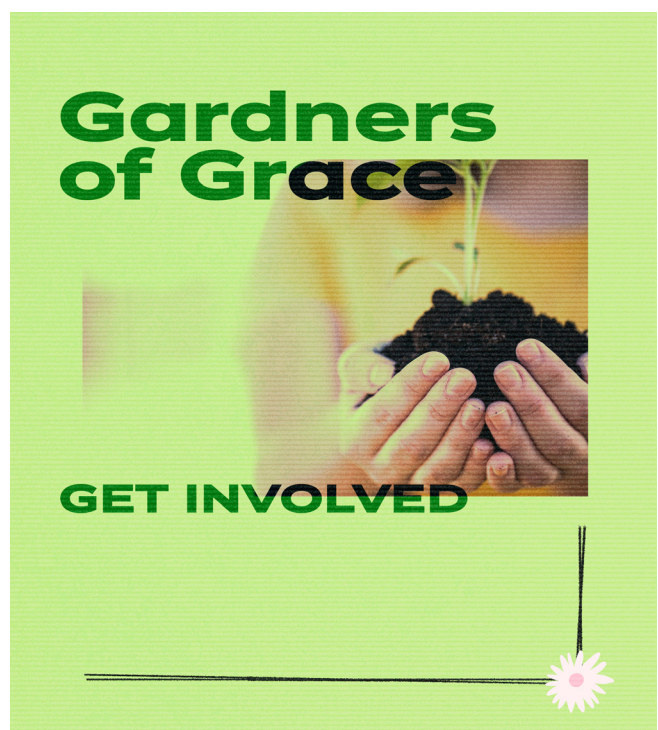
Take time this week to plan a fun meal together as a family. For a bit of a challenge, assign tasks to each family member to help prepare the meal. Let's make it a fun and special meal.

This Week's Intention: Eucharistic Revival

Suggested Prayer: Prayer for Eucharistic Revival

Lord Jesus Christ, you give us your flesh and blood for the life of the world, and you desire that all people come to the Supper of the Sacrifice of the Lamb. Renew in your Church the truth, beauty, and goodness contained in the Most Blessed Eucharist. Jesus living in the Eucharist, come and live in me. Jesus healing in the Eucharist, come and heal me. Did You Know? Corpus Christi

St. Juliana of Liege was the one who became the spark leading to the joyous celebration of Corpus Christi. Juliana had a great veneration for the Eucharist and longed for a special feast day in its honor. In 1208 at age 16, she began having visions of a full moon having one dark stripe. In time she came to understand that the moon symbolizes the life of the Church on earth, the opaque line, represented the absence of a liturgical feast in honor of Christ's Body and Blood. The vision repeated for the next 20 years when she eventually relayed it to her confessor, who relayed it to the Bishop of Liege. In time the celebration became part of the annual celebrations in the

diocese. The archdeacon, Jacques Panteleon of Troyes, was also won over. He eventually became Pope Urban IV in 1264. He instituted the Solemnity of Corpus Christi on the Thursday after Pentecost by papal bull.

While Juliana prepared prayers and music for the feast, Pope Urban requested that St. Thomas Aquinas write an office (special prayers) and hymns for the feast. It is from these offices we have the well known Eucharistic songs: Tantum Ergo, Pange Lingua, and O Salutaris Hostia.
