Although obstacles are simply a part of life, we have become a society that needs instant gratification. We find waiting for anything to be a nuisance. Perhaps when these obstacles arise, we should think of them as God's way of telling us to take time and reflect on the situation instead of immediately resorting to frustration and anger.

For many of us, some obstacles are also of our own making. Personally, I create four of them: I want to take control and do things my way, when I want, and by myself. There is an old Yiddish adage: "Man plans, and God laughs." Well, God laughs at me daily, but when he does, he gives me his mercy and redemption, as in today's psalm. I may stumble and fall often, but I am a work in progress, working

toward a life more centered on what God wants for me, with the hope of keeping my need for control to a minimum.

We hear about our need to live in community throughout the scriptures. However, the verse that resonates with me the most is Mark 6:7, when "Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out

FR. RON'S Reflections



For many years the Catholic Church has dedicated the month of June to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We celebrate the solemnity of the Sacred Heart on the Friday following the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, this past Friday, June 7. (The companion feast was celebrated yesterday, Saturday June 8: The Immaculate Heart of Mary.)

If you were to ask a young child who has just made their First Holy Communion, what happens when they receive the Eucharist, they may respond by saying "Jesus comes to live in my heart." That is a beautiful

response. One of our spiritual goals in life is to make our hearts a living place for Christ's peace.

However, our belief in the Sacred Heart of Jesus reminds us of an even more important spiritual goal: for us to live in the heart of Jesus. To live in the heart of Jesus, is to be immersed in Christ's great compassion, love, and mercy, and to have all that we do flow from it! It is to live in a heart that is willing to suffer for others, as Christ's heart was pierced. When pierced, water and blood flowed from Jesus' heart, the universal symbols of new birth.

Those who live in the heart of Jesus are a wonderful source of new life for the world and for others. I am sure you know compassionate, loving, forgiving people who have such an intimate relationship with Jesus that they themselves are a source of life for others!

Throughout this month we focus on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and work hard to climb into that heart and make our home there!

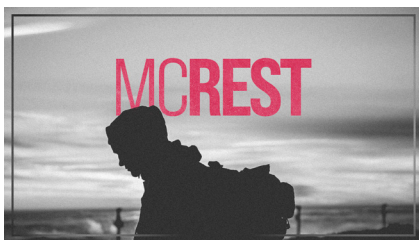

From Foundation to Future

For decades, our community has gathered, prayed, and grown within the walls of our beloved sanctuary, offering the sacrifice of the Mass on our current altar. Now, as we look ahead, we are poised to enhance the heart of our spiritual home. This renewal is not just about furniture; it's about strengthening our commitment to faith and each other, ensuring that our sacred space continues to be a beacon of hope and fellowship for generations to come.

Life-long parishioner, Nancy Campbell was very active in parish life here at St. Isidore, devoting herself in service as a member of the Altar Society as well as other ministries in our community. During the renovation of St. Isidore Church in the early 2000's, it was determined that the purchase of new altar furnishings would not be possible until a much later time when all bills for the renovation had been paid. Unfortunately, Nancy was not able to see the completion

of the renovation as, sadly, she passed away in July, 2018 from a long-term illness. Although Nancy is no longer here with us today, her dedication and love for our church endures. Nancy willed a significant sum of money to St. Isidore for the specific purpose of purchasing new altar furnishings for our parish community. Nancy's dream will soon be fully realized as our new furnishings are installed in the sanctuary next weekend at the Saturday, 4:30 Mass.





What is being changed in the sanctuary?

The altar, ambo, clergy chairs, tabernacle stand, credence table, candle stands, and carpeting.

How is this project being funded?

The project is funded entirely by donations. The majority came

from the will of Nancy Campbell, specifically for this project, and the remainder came from fundraising by our Altar Society.

What will happen to our current furniture?

They are being donated to St. Patrick's Parish of White Lake, MI. Fr. David Cybulski, Priest in Solidum at St. Patrick's has direct ties to our community as his parents are long-time parishioners and he celebrated his first Mass after his ordination here at St. Isidore.

Whose relic will go in our new altar?

We have petitioned Rome for a relic of St. Isidore to be placed in our new altar. If we are not granted this

request, the Archdiocese will select one for us. This continuation of an ancient tradition symbolizes the connection between the witness of the saints to our faith and the celebration of Eucharist.

Did You Know? Sacred Heart of Jesus and The Immaculate Heart of Mary

Let's take a look at the image of Jesus' Sacred Heart: a human heart pierced for our sins and for our salvation. The flames burning atop His heart signify His great love for us. The cross represents His ultimate sacrifice, the crucifixion, and crown of thorns, surrounding His heart, represents His passion. His wounded and bleeding heart is His precious blood spilled for our redemption.

The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a symbol of her compassion and love for Jesus. The Feast established in 1805, refers to the view of Mary's

interior life, considering her joys, sorrow, virtues, and love for God. The devotion aims to unite us to God through Mary's Immaculate Heart; the object to love Jesus better by imitating her virtues. Every day, the world, our selfish desires, and the devil seek our devotion. Jesus and Mary present the consoling truth that God desires us, seeks us, and loves us with an all encompassing love.

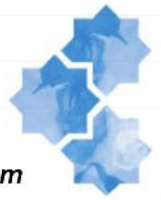
