CONNECTING POINT

Bitterness and anger are like heavy chains that bind our hearts, preventing us from experiencing full joy and peace. They are often born from deep wounds, unmet expectations, or perceived injustices that have taken root over time. To ask, "Where are there bitterness and anger in my life that need to be released?" is to embark on a courageous journey of self-discovery

and healing. In this Sunday's second reading, we hear from St. Paul how "all bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice." Let's take a closer look at how to remove these toxic traits.

Begin by looking inward with honesty and compassion. Reflect on past hurts and unresolved conflicts. Is there lingering resentment toward a friend or family member who wronged you? Do certain memories still evoke a sense of injustice or betrayal? Identifying these sources of bitterness is the first step toward release.

Consider the impacts of holding onto these emotions. Bitterness and anger affect your emotional well-being,

We thank everyone who has stepped forward to plan, donate supplies, and volunteer to help during our MCREST Week, August 18-25. MCREST Week requires many volunteers. "Sheltering the Homeless" is one the Corporal Works of Mercy. Yet, it is difficult to do that on our own. Most of us are not in the position to allow a homeless person or family to come and live with us. Yet, this is something we can do as a

church community. In addition to giving shelter to those who need it, MCREST is an opportunity for our parish to grow in hospitality. I think our past history of hosting MCREST is one reason we are a very hospitable community: many of us working together to serve our guests. Welcoming them, preparing meals, helping with laundry, driving them to places they need to be, etc. We learn to do the Corporal Works

of Mercy the same way we learn to drive a car: by doing it. And spending time with our guests and getting to know them will help us to overcome some prejudgments we have regarding homeless people. For the most part, they are people just like us who are facing a crisis or emergency in their lives. I love the Polish saying: "When a guest is in our house, God is in your house."

as well as your spiritual growth, physical health, and relationships. They can create barriers to love and trust, isolating you from those who care about you. Recognize that releasing these burdens is not about condoning the wrongs done to you but, instead, freeing yourself from their hold.

The next line in the second reading gives us a solution to bitterness and anger: "And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." Forgiveness is a powerful antidote to bitterness. It is a conscious decision to let go of resentment and to extend grace,

even when it feels undeserved.
Forgiving others (and, sometimes, ourselves) opens the door to healing. It allows us to move forward, unencumbered by the weight of past hurts.

Prayer and meditation can be invaluable tools in this process. They offer moments of stillness where you can seek divine guidance and strength. Ask for the courage to face your pain, the wisdom to understand it, and the grace to let it go.

Release the bitterness and anger that have held you captive. Embrace forgiveness, let your heart be light again, and surround yourself with a supportive community that encourages and uplifts you. In this newfound freedom, you will find peace, joy, and a deeper connection to the divine and those around you.

The readings this weekend bring us closer to God through the words and actions of Elijah, St. Paul, and Jesus. All three could rightly have been filled with bitterness and anger, yet they looked past the heavy chains that could have bound their hearts, showing us a pathway to joy and peace.


MCREST - VOLUNTEERS NEEDED







Did You Know? St. Clare of Assisi

August 11th is the feast of St. Clare of Assisi. Clare was born July 16, 1194 as Chiara Offreduccio the eldest daughter of Favorino Scifi, Count of Sasso-Rosso and his wife Ortolana. Clare was a 13th century virgin and friend and contemporary of St. Francis of Assisi, who founded the Clarissan Sisters - the "Poor Clares." Influenced by St. Francis, who rejected wealth and embraced poverty, at 18 Clare meets up with Francis, cuts her hair, dons a tunic of course wool, and finds shelter in the Benedictine monastery. In vain are her father's attempts to bring her home. The

divine light that shines through Clare draws many other women to her, including her mother and sisters. Strong and determined, she is the first woman to write a Rule and obtain approval for it from Pope Gregory IX. She had great devotion to the Eucharistic Lord. Illness marked the last 30 years of her life and she died on August 11, 1253, on the bare floor of San Damiano. (Vatican News)
