
In this Sunday's readings, we are called to examine how we view and treat others, especially those who might be different from us. The second reading from James is clear: "Show no partiality." This instruction challenges us to treat everyone equally, regardless of how they look, dress, or speak. It's a reminder that our biases, whether conscious or unconscious, can blind us to the dignity and worth of those around us.

The Gospel reinforces this message through Jesus' inclusive healing ministry. Jesus didn't discriminate based on status, appearance, or background; he welcomed everyone who came to him. His actions exemplify the kind of inclusivity that we are called to practice in our own lives.

This idea is deepened by the imagery in the first reading: "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened." Our prejudices, often formed by societal norms or personal experiences, can prevent us from truly seeing others for who they are—children of God deserving of love and respect. Just as Jesus healed physical blindness, *continued on page 8*

One of the significant renewals that resulted from the Second Vatican Council was the reinstitution of the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) of Adults. now named the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). Prior to the Council, a person who wanted to become Christian or join the Catholic Church, would meet individually with a priest or another person for "convert classes." We have now returned to the practice of the Early Church when such a person went through an extended period of formation in the Christian way of life. This involved the entire community. as we are called as a Christian community to give birth to new members. Please refer to the article written by Bill Hicks, our Coordinator

of the OCIA, found on page 8 in this issue of Harvest News. Please do what you can to support Bill and his team, and keep those who have entered this process in your prayers.

Today, September 8, nine months after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, is the feast of Mary's Birthday. Because it fell on Sunday the feast gave way to the celebration of the Twenty Third Sunday of Ordinary Time. Still, it may be an opportunity to celebrate it in some ways in our homes. You may want to pray a Hail Mary at your dinner table, or even pray the Rosary with your family. You may also want to make a contribution to our Baby Pantry in honor of Mary. I am writing this on August 29, the Feast of the Passion of John the Baptist. Jesus himself called John the Baptist the "greatest man born of a woman." The Sculpture on our Baptismal Pool includes Jesus, Mary, and John the Baptist. John is pointing to Jesus. One of the things that makes John great is that he is the one who pointed out our Savior when he came. This sculpture is a profound way we honor John the Baptist here at St. Isidore. We again thank parishioner and artist Kurt Klein who sculpted the beautiful work of art.

Choir: No Experience Needed: Just Your Passion!



The Journey from OCIA to "Our-CIA" -Monthly Update

I am pleased to report that the Disciples Unleashed 2024/2025 Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is off to a fantastic start! Our August 28th "Becoming Catholic / Completing Sacraments" informational night attracted a diverse group of people who are discerning a call to become Catholic or are seeking to come into the fullness of the faith by completing their Sacraments. Although the attendees represented a wide range of ages and varied walks of life, they all shared an eagerness to learn more about our faith and to grow closer to Jesus. As this is my first year as OCIA Coordinator for our Family of Parishes (FoP), I found the chance to meet this group and join them on their respective faith journeys both exciting and a bit daunting.

Equally exciting was seeing a dedicated Host Team of FoP parishioners and staff members come together to extend a warm and sincere welcome to our invited guests. The OCIA inquirers were treated to some delicious summertime treats, and the outstanding hospitality of our Host Team helped to set a fun and relaxing atmosphere in which to learn the details of their upcoming journey toward full communion with the Church.

A heartfelt thank you goes out to our Host Team volunteers and to all who have offered and continue to offer their prayers for OCIA's success. Please, keep those prayers coming our way! It has been wonderful to see such a positive initial response to the challenge of transitioning OCIA into a Family of Parishes-wide "Our-CIA" process.

Looking ahead, our first OCIA session of the year will begin next Sunday, September 15, at 10:30 AM in classroom #9 at St. Isidore. There is still time for anyone interested in exploring the Catholic faith or preparing to complete their Catholic Sacraments to join us. However, the clock is ticking! Those interested can make inquiries by emailing ocia@ stisidore.church, visiting one of the local FoP websites, or texting 586-345-0825 (please reference "OCIA" in your text message).

As we move into October, we will be seeking some friendly, faithful, and involved FoP parishioners (yes, that could be you) who would be willing to sign up for one Sunday per month to assist in setting up our hospitality table for the OCIA sessions. We will provide the goods; we just need your hands and smiling faces to help us set it up and assist in welcoming our catechumens and candidates. If you'd like to stay for the entire OCIA session, you would have that option and be most welcomed. This could be an opportunity to brush up on your own faith or share some of your experiences, but it's totally optional on your part. Your hospitality before the session begins is the main thing. By asking for just one Sunday per month, we hope that more people might be able to work an hour or so of "Our-CIA" into their busy schedules. However, we will certainly welcome any level of commitment you can give us. 

we are called to seek healing for our spiritual blindness—the biases that cloud our vision and judgment.

Pope Francis has often spoken about the importance of inclusivity in the Church and our personal lives. He encourages us to "build bridges, not walls" to reach out and embrace those who are marginalized or overlooked by society. This task isn't always easy; it requires us to confront our discomforts and prejudices. But it is essential for living out the Gospel's message.

So, how do we do this? We can begin by making small but

meaningful changes: being more welcoming to newcomers, refraining from making snap judgments, and treating everyone with the same kindness and respect that we want for ourselves. In doing so, we open our eyes to the richness of God's creation and become a reflection of his love in the world.

Family of Parishes Youth Minister -Diana Devine

Tell me something about your

beliefs. I really believe that the youth are the current church and without them there won't be a continuation. The more that youth are given responsibilities in the church, (just because you're young doesn't mean you can't do something) the more they will feel included and want to be more present.

What is an upcoming goal you have for the Family of Parishes (FOP)

youth? We are currently planning a worship night in December. All the teens across the diocese will be invited. There will be a speaker/ musician that will be coming. It is all very exciting and this event just started in action today!

How would you describe your call to the youth ministry? I've been involved in youth ministry for over 12 years. It is a big part of who I am. In 2017 I attended my first mission trip as a camper on a youth mission trip, where I later transitioned into the role of a chaperone. In 2022 I spent the summer working for the same mission trip, this time as a staff member responsible for coordinating activities like stage performances, skits, and engaging with the kids. It was an incredible experience, and I knew helping kids grow in their faith was my true calling. During most of 2022 and 2023, I dedicated myself to discerning my calling, which ultimately led me to a job posting for Disciples Unleashed FoP. The moment I saw it, I knew I had to apply. Two weeks later, I interviewed for the position, got the job, and felt certain that this is where I'm meant to be.

Who are your spiritual role models?

St. Dymphna is my favorite saint. She is the Patron saint of mental health and anxiety. I pray to St. Dymphna all the time. I feel that dealing with anxiety is very important for today's youth. My grandma is my other role model. She lost a lot (both of her children and her partner) yet she never lost her faith. This inspires me.

What is your approach to evangelism? I like to understand where the youth group is and then build off it. I feel it is important to know where kids are first so that they can make a connection to faith easier. Sharing my story and involvement in the church shows the youth where I come from. I enjoy introducing the many sides of faith to them that they may not have seen—even though they may have been to church many times.

If you had three words to describe yourself, what would they be?

Kindness, understanding, and empathy. You can also say I'm fun and exciting!

What would be a message that you would want to share with the youth? There is no wrong way to pray, there

are so many ways! It's okay if you don't pray the same as others—just pray!




