The aspect of team leadership that I have always found challenging is bringing different people together to foster collaboration toward a goal. For the sake of its financial viability and stockholders, a company's goals must be collectively achieved through a team of individuals who collaborate.

Sometimes, however, people prioritize their achievements over the group's. Other workers are biased and pass judgment on others for holding different views. Still, others are perfectionists, which stifles flexibility and collaboration.

I am sure we have all

experienced these obstacles while working in an organization; we can probably think of coworkers with these qualities! The challenge, then, is to shift the group from an "I know it all" attitude to a "Let's learn together" mentality, which would change the focus from individual achievements to the

The priests of our Archdiocese recently received a letter from Archbishop Vigneron asking us to promote the great work of the Knights of Columbus and encourage men of our parish to join the Knights.

As Bishop Vigneron points out, the Knights of Columbus were founded in 1892 by Father Michael McGivney, a young priest who saw a need for an organization supporting Catholic immigrants to his parish. His efforts have grown into a fraternity of more than two million members in 16 countries who live their faith through

charitable works, defending their faith, and caring for their families.

I have witnessed the good work of the Knights since joining the Centerline Council nearly fifty years ago, and from serving a couple of years as Archdiocese of Detroit chaplain in the mid-eighties. I have been chaplain for many K of C Councils in the ten different parishes I have ministered in, and they all do great work. But no Council even comes close to Council 7200, our St. Isidore Council. In addition to their vast charitable work for the mentally

impaired and other ministries, they are very active in our parish, always among the first to help out and support parish activities.

Our Knights are a very welcoming and friendly group, and have a very close sense of community. I encourage men of our parish to consider joining them and to check them out after Mass at the upcoming Recruitment Sundays, We can all support their work by patronizing the annual Lenten Fish Frys, quarterly Pancake Breakfasts, Tootsie Roll Drives, etc.

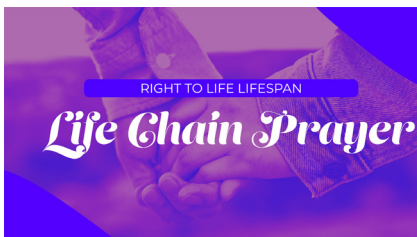

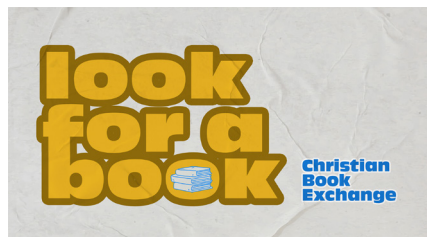

Did You Know? October is the Month of the Rosary

The Holy Rosary is an enormous source of grace and spiritual protection, one of the most powerful sacramentals of the Catholic Church. Our Lady revealed 15 promises to St. Dominic (the saint to whom the rosary was first given in the 12th century) and later to Blessed Alan de la Roche (who reignited devotion to the rosary in the 15th century) to those who would faithfully recite the rosary. The 15 promises include signal graces and special protection and aid. "The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation

of the rosary shall not perish." Our Lady also stated that recitation of the rosary "will cause good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for Eternal things. Oh, that the soul would sanctify themselves by this means!"

► I Came So That They May Have Life

During the Easter Vigil liturgy, the single flame of the Easter candle shines through the darkness. That small flame spreads as each person's candle is lit and the light of Christ is shared with others. Before we know it, the entire Church is ablaze with the warm glow of candlelight and the darkness has been vanquished.

We are each called by God to be that light of Christ that breaks through the darkness. We are called to be his disciples, continually transformed by our encounter with him and sharing in his mission. Jesus came that we might have life.

Part of the impetus for the Eucharistic Revival was a concern that some Catholics do not believe, or at least do not understand, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. Even though our human senses perceive bread and wine, the Eucharist is Jesus—body, blood, soul, and divinity. Similarly, some may not realize or acknowledge the sanctity of human life when it is hidden in the womb. Both instances call for us to help others recognize these sacred gifts that may not be perceivable through our human senses. We need to help others understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not important.

We live in a society that rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable. Yet, it is precisely within these conditions that a person is most in reminds us that “every child who, rather than being born,

is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ, bears the face of the Lord, who even before he was born, and then just after birth, experienced the world's rejection.”¹

As Pope St. John Paul II wrote, “we are facing an enormous and dramatic clash between good and evil, death and life, the ‘culture of death’ and the ‘culture of life’. ...we are all involved and we all share in it, with the inescapable responsibility of choosing to be unconditionally pro-life.”²

In the face of challenges, we may feel that we are not equal to the task of overcoming the darkness. Yet, we are not alone. Jesus tells us, “I am with you always, until the end of the age” (Matthew 28:20).

Jesus gave his very flesh to give us the gift of eternal life and invites us to the most profound experience of this gift in our celebration of the Eucharist. When we meet Jesus in the Eucharist, this encounter has the power to change us. The Eucharist has the power to transform the depths of our hearts and the heart of our culture. United to the power of his Eucharistic Presence, may we work to ensure that each person has life—and has it in abundance.

God alone is the Lord of Life from its beginning to its end: no one can under any circumstances claim for

himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being.”

We ask you to commit to prayer and fasting during Respect Life Month and dedicate your prayers to the conversion of hearts to the Gospel of Life. Please pray for an end to abortion, euthanasia, child trafficking, and all life issues. St. Isidore is sponsoring or supporting several activities to promote Respect Life Month. collective success of the team.

Jesus encountered many strong personalities in his team, as well; in fact, we hear in today’s Gospel about his beloved disciple, John—one of the brothers Jesus named the “Sons of Thunder.” Ouch! They must have been a handful for Jesus! John became disturbed because someone other than the disciples was performing miracles in Jesus’ name. In his mind, he and his fellow disciples were chosen by Jesus, so they were exclusive in doing the work. We see the same idea in the first reading, in which Joshua complained to Moses about Eldad and Medad. Joshua wanted Moses to exclude them because they

were not among the group present at the tent to receive the Holy Spirit. However, the Lord sent them the Holy Spirit anyway.

Through scripture, the Lord urges us to stop finding differences and faults in each other when, really, everyone has the same goal. Working to realize the goal of producing the kingdom of God on Earth requires us to foster collaboration with others in the spirit of Jesus. We need to cut out elements that hinder genuine connection and mutual growth, such as our self-centered tendencies, judgments, prejudices, and perfectionist desires. By letting go of these elements, we can

start to focus on our similarities in spreading the Gospel. We can play to each other’s unique strengths and come together as a team despite our differences. Our society tells us to “cancel” people if they do not believe as the mainstream group does. As disciples, we must resist this approach, for it brings hurtful division and keeps ourselves and others from deeper relationships with God. Working together creates a space where genuine collaboration and understanding can thrive, reflecting the love and unity that Jesus calls us to embody. I believe that this Gospel message is something we should seriously reflect on, especially as we approach November!

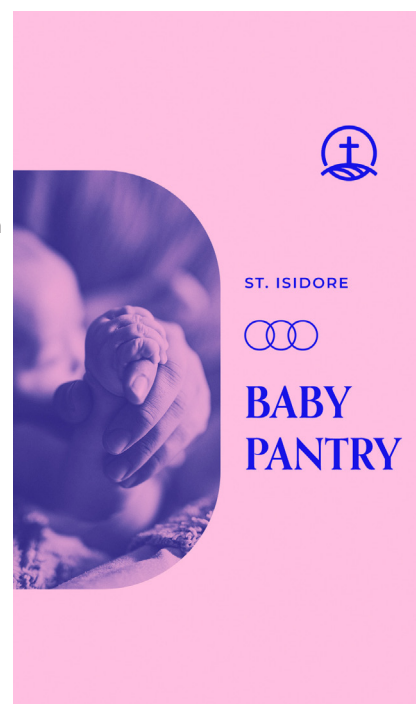
