Christ calls you to honor your commitments more completely by inviting you to reflect his character of faithfulness, integrity, and love, in all aspects of your life. Through his teachings and example, Jesus demonstrates what it means to be truly committed—both to God and others. Here

are a few major ways he may be calling you to honor your commitments more fully:

- 1. Faithfulness in All Things**
Jesus calls you to be faithful, even in the small things. Luke 16:10 says, “The person who is trustworthy

in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones.” In other words, honoring your commitments isn’t just about big promises but also everyday tasks and responsibilities. Christ calls you to follow through on your word, fulfilling all promises and duties with

Did You Know? Our Lady of the Rosary

October 7th is a memorial feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary that originated in 1571, when the battle of Lepanto saw an invading Muslim army defeated in Greece after Saint Pius V called the faithful to pray the rosary for the protection of Europe. In essence, the rosary is a contemplative immersion in the lives of Jesus and Mary, and a powerful weapon in the spiritual warfare every Christian must in some way face. When we pray

the rosary devoutly, we "*put on the armor of God, that we may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold our ground.*" (Eph 6:13)

► 10 Surprising Things That Happen When You Go to Adoration More Often - Part I

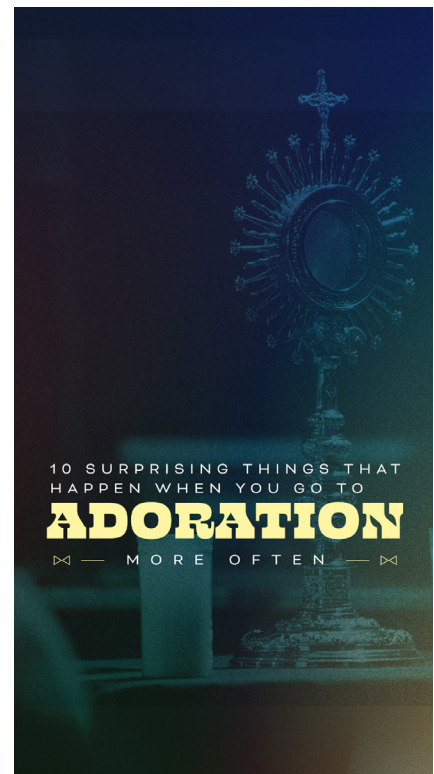

It will offer you certain positive sensations, yet it is always colored with a fleeting and inconsistent kind of occurrence. An interior progress, on the other hand, means it is you who are changed.

▶ Single Use Plastics

Single-use plastics, also known as disposable plastics, are items made primarily from fossil fuel-based chemicals and are meant to be used once and then discarded.

- Single-use plastic pose significant environmental threats due to their persistence in the ecosystem and contribution to pollution.
- This plastic harms wildlife, contaminates waterways, and contributes to the global plastic crisis.
- Efforts to reduce single-use plastic consumption and implement sustainable alternatives are essential for environmental conservation.
- Examples of single-use plastics include plastic bottles, wrappers, straws, bags, plastic cutlery, plastic cups & plates.

Things you can do to help.

- Use paper straws, water

containers that you can refill, paper cups, and plates.

- Clean shopping bags can be returned to grocery stores. Many of the major stores have return containers.
- Purchase laundry soap sheets instead of laundry soap in plastic containers.
- Clean plastic bags can be donated to create mats, pillows, etc. for the homeless. These can be taken to; Michigan Mitten, 24623 Harper Ave., St. Clair Shores, MI 48080.

Something to think about -

Sometimes it seems immaterial to pick up empty plastic bottles or litter on your walk around the neighborhood, we think that someone else will do it. You walk the same way the next day and guess what, they are still there! This is a small job that you could do and offer it to God as a gift from you. No one

need know why you do it, it's a gift just from you.

There are little things every day you can offer to Him and every one of them is a gift that is sure to please Him because they are from you.

Matthew 6:6 says, "But when you pray go to your room, close the door, and pray to your Father, who is unseen. And your Father, who sees what you do in private, will reward you."

When your commitments become difficult or inconvenient, Christ calls you to persevere, trusting that his strength is sufficient for you. Following through on difficult promises is an act of faith and an opportunity to grow spiritually.

4. Embracing Grace and Forgiveness

Finally, Christ calls you to honor your commitments with grace. There will be times when you fall short, but Christ offers forgiveness and the chance to begin again. By embracing his grace, you can move forward, honoring your commitments with renewed strength and purpose.

Ultimately, Christ calls you to honor your commitments more completely by living with integrity, serving others with love, and depending on his grace and strength.

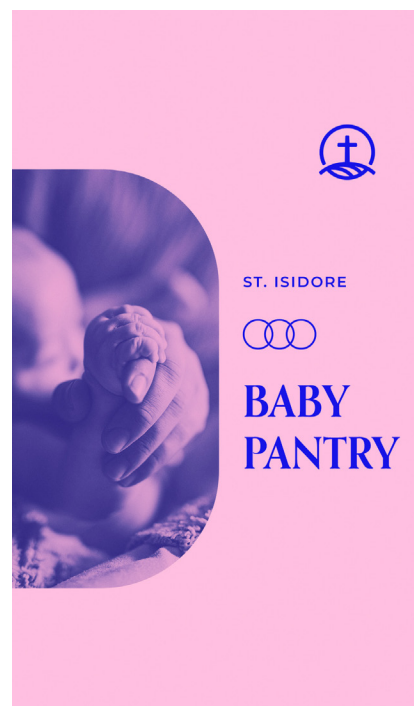
