Never will anyone who says the Rosary every day be led astray. This is a statement that I would gladly sign with my blood.

In order to pray well, it is not enough to give expression to our petitions by means of that


most excellent of all prayers, the Rosary, but we must also pray with real concentration for God listens more to the voice of the heart than that of the mouth.
