Loving others and loving God are deeply intertwined, which is at the core of most spiritual teachings. This weekend we hear Jesus himself declare that the greatest commandments are to love God with all one's heart and to love one's neighbor as oneself. These two commandments are not separate but interconnected, suggesting that

genuine love for God is expressed through how we treat others.

When we claim to love God but fail to love others, we are neglecting an essential aspect of what it means to love in the divine sense. Fast-forwarding to a weekday reading shortly after Christmas we hear in 1 John 4:20, "If anyone says, 'I love

God,' but hates his brother, he is liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen." This implies that our love for God is reflected in our actions toward those around us. Love for others is the visible manifestation of our love for God.

This principle of loving others

healthy debates and disagreements without falling into hatred or disdain. Whether discussing policies, voting for a candidate, or engaging in community activism, we are called to prioritize the well-being of others, ensuring that love and compassion guide our decisions.

The upcoming election presents an opportunity for voters and candidates alike to demonstrate

this kind of love. While there are significant and often contentious issues at stake, from climate change to borders, the process can still be grounded in a respect for each person's inherent dignity. In doing so, we align our actions with a higher principle—one that calls for unity through love, even when we may disagree on the details of how best to move forward.

Suggested Prayer: Prayer of St. Gertrude the Great

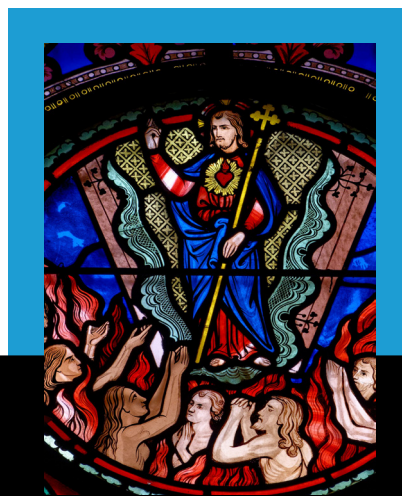

Did You Know? Month of the Souls in Purgatory

The Church Suffering (those in Purgatory) and the Church Militant (us) constitute in their relations a second circle of most vital activities. Having entered into the night "wherein no man can work," the Suffering Church cannot ripen to its final blessedness by any efforts of his own, but only through the help of others—through the intercessory prayers and sacrifices of those living members of the body of Christ who being still in this world are able in the grace of Christ to perform expiatory works. The Church has from the earliest times faithfully guarded the words of

Scripture that it is a holy and wholesome thing to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins. 2 Macab. 12:43

Visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed can obtain a partial indulgence for the Souls in Purgatory. A plenary indulgence for the Souls in Purgatory is granted when the faithful piously visit a church on November 2nd and recite one Our Father and one Hail Mary or by visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 - 8.

Men of St. Isidore! Have you ever toyed with the idea of joining our Knights of Columbus, but never followed through? Maybe you're curious and feel you need more information. Next weekend, November 9 & 10 we will be conducting our annual membership drive after all Masses. In preparation of next weekend, here is the verbiage we received in a letter from Archbishop Vigneron on his thoughts and memories of being a Knights of Columbus member:

Dear Men,

We are very much in a time of testing. There is a certain "sifting" going on (Luke 22:31). Gone are the days when one could be carried along by the currents of a Christian culture. Yet, these are glorious days to be alive. Days when we are being called to make a conscious effort to follow the Lord. These are days in which we must, in essence, be men.

St. Pope John Paul II tells us that one only finds himself by giving himself. It is a man's calling to give himself, following the pattern of Jesus Christ, and by doing so to lead others to our Lord and Savior.

One group that I find particularly good for the life of Catholic men is The Knights of Columbus. Founded in 1882 by Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney, The Knights of Columbus provide Catholic men the opportunity to live their faith through charitable works, caring for their families and defending the Catholic faith.

My father, brothers, and I were part of the group that chartered the Knights of Columbus council at our home parish back in 1991. It has been my experience that the Knights contribute to the strength of families, and of parishes, among many other

things. The Knights also play a crucial role in financial support for our seminarians, and often act as a stepping stone for those discerning the priesthood, as a great number of priests were knights before entering seminary.

I strongly encourage all men in our archdiocese, who are at least 18 years old, to prayerfully consider joining a Knights of Columbus council. As our young people feel more and more isolated, being involved in a council is a wonderful way to build authentic Catholic community among men. In The Knights of Columbus, I know you will find a warm welcome among the men who share your love for the Church.
