This Sunday's readings introduce us to two widows who, despite their poverty, give everything they have to support others. Their actions speak to a deeper richness that goes beyond material wealth—one rooted in their identity and willingness to give.

Whether we realize it or not, we all

tend to place boundaries on our generosity. We might give only what we think someone needs or offer items we no longer use rather than providing something new and chosen with care. Sometimes, we hold back, especially if we've formed assumptions—like assuming that someone on the street will misuse the money we offer. Our giving can even be limited within the church! Understandably, not everyone feels inclined to support operational expenses like new roofs, heating, or staff wages. Yet, for St. Isidore Church to continue reaching out, both locally and globally, it requires resources and dedicated people. Here, your generosity fuels meaningful efforts like the Lenten

We are delighted to welcome Deacon Mark Sienkowski to our St. Isidore family! As he steps into his new role, Deacon Mark brings with him a wealth of experience, a deep commitment to service, and a compassionate spirit that truly embodies our mission of faith and community. In his own words, Deacon Mark shares his background, calling, and the journey that led him to join us. We look forward to the many ways he will inspire and guide our parish family in the years to come.

From Deacon Mark:

I was ordained on Oct. 5th by Archbishop Vigneron, and I am thrilled to be assigned to St. Isidore Parish, serving under Fr. Ron and alongside Deacon Jeff and the entire staff.

Throughout my life, I had no inkling that God would call me to this ministry. It wasn't even on my radar. But my journey began when a coworker suggested I attend a diaconate information night. I immediately dismissed the idea as not for me. But, just as immediately, God spoke up and said, "Do you think you know better than me how to use your gifts?" I didn't want to argue with God, so I told him I would take a first step and attend an information night to learn more. Well, that information night led me to register for one class at the seminary. That one

class changed my world. It opened my heart more fully to God, led me to take many more classes, and eventually to pursue the permanent diaconate. Now, five years later, I am grateful and blessed to join the "Disciples Unleashed" family here at St. Isidore.

So, here is a bit more about me. I was born in Dearborn Heights, one of 11 children. My family then moved to Sterling Heights, where I attended Henry Ford II High School and then college at the University of Michigan, majoring in Computer Science. My first date with my wife Carol was on the last day of high school when we went to Irma's Frozen Custard in Shelby (perhaps some of you know it well). This year, we celebrated our 40th anniversary on Oct. 20th. Most of those 40 years, we were parishioners at St. Lawrence parish, where all three of our children attended grade school. The children are now grown, have graduated from college (MSU, even though their father went to U of M), and are homeowners of their own (all in the Royal Oak area). The oldest two are married, and we are blessed to be grandparents of four, the youngest of which will be my first baptism as a deacon. Advent is upon us and in preparation for the new church year, we are looking for new volunteers for various roles, including:


- Lectors: Proclaim the Word of God.



This Week's Intention: The Poor and Vulnerable

Suggested Prayer: Intercession of Mother Cabrini. God our Father, you called Frances Xavier Cabrini from Italy to serve the immigrants of America. By her example teach us concern for the stranger, the sick, the frustrated. By her prayers help us see Christ in all the men and women we meet. Grant this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen. The world is too small for what I intend to do." Mother Cabrini

Did You Know? Saint Francis Xavier Cabrini

The first American citizen canonized a saint in 1946 by the Catholic Church, Frances Cavier Cabrini was above all a remarkable humanitarian. She was born in Italy in 1850. In 1880, she founded the order of Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart in Rome with the purpose of serving the poor, vulnerable, and those on the margins of society in Europe and America. In 1889, Mother Cabrini came to the United States to help immigrants in Manhattan, the Bronx, and Brooklyn. Thirteen years later, she arrived in Colorado to help Denver's poor Italian immigrants. She established institutions in several other states. Her social outreach programs included convents, schools, orphanages, summer camps, visits to hospital wards, jails, prisons, mines, and plantations. Frances Xavier Cabrini died in 1917, at the Columbus Hospital in Chicago that she helped open in 1896 to address the needs of Italian immigrants.


