so will we. Are we prepared for their departure—and for our own? Have we truly considered that our journey to eternity could happen at any moment, whether for those we cherish or for ourselves?

This reflection raises a powerful question—one that grows more intense, even a bit unsettling, though I hesitate to say frightening. The question is:

If you only had a week to reconcile relationships, who would you reach out to first?

The truth is, we don't know the day

or the hour, so why wait? This truth demands our attention. We must face, live with, and embrace it; both they and we will be gone sooner or later. Our time is precious and finite. God has set a limit on their lives and ours. Being surprised by this limit without preparation would be a tragedy—not in the act of dying but in our lack of readiness for it.

Dying is brief; it's what comes next that calls for serious attention. As the book of Daniel powerfully reminds us, on the day of resurrection, "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace" (Daniel 12:2).

The author of Hebrews affirms that Christ died to forgive the sins of humanity (cf. Heb 10:11-14, 18). Yet, we may have our own need to forgive someone—or to seek forgiveness from someone—before either of us dies. Who might that person be? Perhaps we need to reconcile with ourselves or with God. Let us pause and ask the Holy Spirit to help us discern whom we need to forgive or seek forgiveness from. Once we know, let us also ask for the grace to reach out, simply and sincerely, and say: Forgive me.

Disciples Unleashed parishioners who regularly attend Sunday Mass at either 9:30AM or 9:45AM are likely to be quite familiar with the OCIA process since these are the Masses that host the Rites of the Catechumens and Candidates each year. For the rest of us, OCIA is probably just another entry in the "alphabet soup" of our busy daily lives.

Over the coming months, we will use the bulletin to keep the faith journeys of our brothers and sisters in the OCIA process at the forefront of the thoughts and prayers of our entire Disciples Unleashed Family of Parishes community.

Today, at St. Isidore and St. Therese of Lisieux, a Rite of Acceptance & Welcome is being celebrated for 16 adults and 4 children who will either Become Catholic or complete their Catholic Sacraments at the next Easter Vigil. The significance of this Rite is perhaps best summed up in the opening prayer of the Rite of Acceptance of the Catechumens:

"My brothers and sisters, this is truly a day of joy! As we do each Sunday, today we gather in the presence of the Holy Spirit, as we give thanks and praise to God for the gift of Jesus Christ, the anointed one, to whom we offer our love, our honor, our thanks, our entire lives.

Today, we will welcome new inquirers into the catechumenate. Over the coming year, they will prepare for their initiation into the Christian faith by baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist.

You are very important in this rite, for it is the entire Church – those in this community as well as the entire Body of Christ that is beyond the walls of this place – that accepts these inquirers as persons who intend to become members."

Please keep our OCIA travelers in your prayers today, and throughout the duration of their journey; giving glory, praise and thanksgiving always to our God for the wonderous gift of His Church – alive and growing in grace!



Did You Know? 10 Facts About St. Therese of Lisieux

- **Birth:** Born Marie-Francoise-Therese Martin on Jan. 2, 1873 in Alecon, France.
- **Family:** Youngest of nine children and her mother died of breast cancer when she was four.
- Education: Considered an odd one out at school.
- **Carmel:** Entered the Carmelite monastery of Lisieux at age 15, after being refused admission a year earlier.
- **Death:** Died of tuberculosis at age 24 on Sept. 30, 1897.
- **Patron Saint:** Of missionaries, florists, pilots, priests, and the sick.

- Doctor of the Church: In 1997, Pope John Paul II named her a doctor of the Church, making her the youngest in the history of Catholicism.
- Little Way: Exemplified the "Little Way," the spiritual maxim to do little things with great love.
- **Devotion:** Had a special devotion to St. Joan of Arc.
- **Autobiography:** Went through many intentional revisions in the early days of its publication.
- Nickname: Also known as the Little Flower or St. Therese of the Child Jesus.

Surviving the Holidays

The holidays are quickly approaching, and for most, they are the "most wonderful time of the vear." but for others who are grieving the loss of a loved one, the holidays can be extremely difficult. Holidays mark the passage of time in our lives. They are part of the milestones we share with each other and they generally represent time spent with family. They bring meaning to certain days, and we bring much meaning back to them. Since holidavs are for being with those we love the most, how on earth can anyone be expected to cope with them when a loved one has died? For many people, this is the hardest part of grieving; missing our loved ones even more than usual. How can you celebrate togetherness when there is none? When you have lost someone special, your world loses its celebratory qualities. Holidays only magnify the loss. The sadness feels sadder and the loneliness goes deeper. The need for support may be greatest during the holidays. You can, and will, get through the holidays. Rather than avoiding the feelings of grief, lean into them. It is not the grief you want to avoid, it is the pain. Grief is the way out of the pain. Grief is our internal feeling and mourning is our external expressions.

Ways to externalize the loss – give it a time and a place

- Say a prayer before the Holiday dinner, about your loved one.
- Light a candle for your loved one.
- Create an online tribute for them.
- Share a favorite story about your loved one.

- Have everyone tell a funny story about your loved one.
- Here at church, remember them in a prayer.
- Chat online about them.

Do's and Don'ts

- Do be gentle with yourself and protect yourself.
- Don't do more than you want, and don't do anything that does not serve your soul and your loss.
- Do allow time for the feelings.
- Don't keep feelings bottled up. If you have 500 tears to cry don't stop at 250.
- Do allow others to help. We all need help at certain times in our lives.
- Don't ask if you can help or should help a friend in grief. Just help. Find ways; invite them to group events or just out for coffee.
- Do, in grief, pay extra attention to the children. Children are too often the forgotten grievers.

Ways to Cope

Have a Plan A/Plan B - Plan A is you go to the Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, or Christmas Eve dinner with family and friends. If it doesn't feel right, have your plan B ready. Plan B may be a movie you both liked or a photo album to look through or a special place you went to together. Many people find that when they have Plan B in place, just knowing it is there is enough.

Cancel the Holiday all together. Yes, you can cancel the Holiday. If you are going through the motions and feeling nothing, cancel them. Take a year off. They will come around again. For others, staying involved with the holidays is a symbol of life continuing. Let the Holiday routine give you a framework during these tough times.

Try the holidays in a new way. Grief has a unique way of giving us the permission to evaluate what parts of the holidays you enjoy and what parts you don't. Remember, there is no right or wrong way to handle the holidays in grief. You have to decide what is right for you and do it. You have every right to change your mind, even a few times. Friends and family members may not have a clue how to help you through the holidays and you may not either.

It is natural to feel you may never enjoy the holidays again. They will certainly never be the same as they were. However, in time, most people are able to find meaning again in the traditions as a new form of the Holiday Spirit grows inside of them. Even without grief, our friends and relatives often think they know how our holidays should look, what "the family" should and shouldn't do.
