And somewhat old, as many of them are senior citizens. We thank them for their ministry. One thing that made St. Isidore the Farmer a saint was his ability to feed the hungry, even though he and his wife Maria were themselves rather poor. Feeding the hungry is one way to honor him and to live out our charism as a parish under his patronage.

Ways We Can Help the Environment

Reduce your carbon "footprint." Our lakes and oceans are on the front line of climate change, absorbing about half of the carbon dioxide we've pumped into the atmosphere. Some ways we can help to stop carbon dioxide is to use mass transit and carpooling. Combine more trips at one time instead of several trips on different days, map out the stops you need to make for a more convenient route. This will also save on gas!

Another way to remove our "footprint," is not to use chemical fertilizers and pesticides on lawns and bushes. When your driveway, porches, or sidewalks need cleaning, don't use harmful cleaning products. (Dawn dish soap cleans a lot of

things.) Please take care of spilled oil and other chemicals are some examples.

Urge your friends, family, business owners, and elected representatives to support environmental policies. Policies which can protect our environment. Stay informed on alerts, like when NOT to gas your car when the weather is super-hot. Another way to share your passion is on Facebook and other media sites. There are many recycling drop-off locations throughout Michigan. Please visit the "Michigan Recycling Directory." Enter in the type of material you are looking to recycle into the search bar to find a location near you.

Some communities often host collection events for tires, electronics, batteries, paint, cleaning products, paper shredding, and more. To find one near you, search the internet and type in "Michigan. gov/recycling Directory.

unique person, but I would like to suggest that awareness of God's presence when we go out the church doors is a good practice. It takes discipline and creativity. The familiar words attributed to St. Francis of Assisi come to mind: "Preach the Gospel and, when necessary, use words." That means we can preach the Gospel by praying for others. For instance, when at a red light, perhaps you could whisper a prayer for all the motorists around you, asking God that they have a blessed day. How about adopting the attitude of gratitude? When walking down the street, notice the trees and birds and thank God for all of creation. Keep trying to hone your awareness of God as continual worship.

Another suggestion is to give God glory by your example. A smile, kind word, or kind deed is a good way to practice God's presence and remind others that God cares for them. Thus, with practice and creativity, you may notice that you are responding to God's love with all of your heart, soul, mind, and strength. Is that not worshiping fully?

The Gospel for the fourth Sunday of Advent this year begins with Mary leaving home to help her cousin, Elizabeth: "Mary set out in haste to the hill country..." Each time we leave God's house to enter the temple of God's world, let us imitate Mary, going "in haste" to do so.

During this Advent, let us ask Mary, who brought Jesus into the world, to give us the mindfulness to carry Jesus into "our world" in ways that we cannot even ask for or imagine.

Did You Know? Gifts of the Magi

We interview every family we assist, give advice and referrals, and also provide some of the family's necessary baby items. Each family we interview increases our commitment to this vital ministry.






