FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH



CONNECTING POINT

Family life is full of love and joy, but it can also bring its share of stress. In this Sunday's Gospel, we get a glimpse into a very human moment for the Holy Family. Mary and Joseph lose track of 12-year-old Jesus for three days—imagine their panic! When they finally find Him in the temple, Mary says what any parent might: "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been

looking for you with great anxiety."

We've all had moments like this in our families. Maybe it's the uncertainty of our kids' decisions, the challenges of caring for an aging parent, or just navigating the ups and downs of life together. Like Mary and Joseph, we can find ourselves asking, "Why is this happening? What should I do?"

This Gospel reminds us that even in the middle of anxiety and confusion, we're not alone. Mary and Joseph didn't understand why Jesus stayed behind, but they trusted that God had a plan for Him. They remind us that we don't need all the answers to stay close to God.

Trusting God through family stress doesn't mean our worries magically

Suggested Prayer/Activity: Take some time to review this past year. How has God worked in your life? Has He answered your prayers in unexpected ways? Did He comfort you as you trusted in Him? Did You Know?January, The Month of the Holy Name of Jesus

In the Name of Jesus let every knee bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth and let every tongue confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father. (Phil 2:10-11)

According to the ancient mind, a person's name was the expression of his nature, work, or mission. Several symbols are used for Jesus' name. The Chi-Rho, IHS, the Cross, and the Ichtys.

One symbol the early Church used for Jesus was the Ichtys. Christ's full title was (in Greek): Iesous Christos Theou Yos Soter, Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior. The initial letters of these five words form the Greek word ICHTHYS, which means fish. For this reason Christ is often pictured as a fish. Thus both the abbreviation and the picture became for the early Christians a secret symbol for the Redeemer. Tertullian, a prolific early Christian author from Carthage, wrote around 200AD about Baptism, "We (Christians) are born as little fishes in water after the model of our lchthys Jesus Christ."

disappear. It means handing those worries to Him and trusting that He's walking with us. When we feel overwhelmed, we can ask for God's guidance, lean on prayer, and remember that He's with us, even when life feels uncertain.

So, how can we trust God through family anxiety this week? Maybe it's by taking a deep breath and asking God to give us peace. Maybe it's by letting go of the things we can't control. Or maybe it's as simple as remembering that God loves our family even more than we do.

Supporting Our Neighbors in Need:

SVdP is dedicated to providing compassionate support to those in need, whether through food, clothing, or financial assistance. Beyond material aid, Vincentians serve as kindhearted friends and attentive listeners, transforming lives through small acts of kindness and care

SVdP 2024 annual report is as follows:

- Annual Cash Expenditures Report:
 - Number of people in need helped 325
 - Number of families in need helped 132
 - Rent & mortgage paid \$43,182
 - Utilities paid \$4,847

Annual Pantry Report:

- Number of people in need served 2,627
- Number of families in need helped 715
- Value of food distributed \$84,551

• Annual Miscellaneous Items Report:

- Number of people in need helped 128
- Number of families in need helped 32
- Gas paid \$375
- Clothing vouchers \$3,615
- Household goods vouchers \$775

This year, SVdP was once again selected as a beneficiary of the Meijer "Simply Give" program in Macomb Township. With a 21% increase in families served this year, the partnership has been critical in sustaining our food pantry and addressing the growing demand. We are deeply thankful to Meijer and our generous parishioners for helping ensure no one in our community goes hungry.

Lastly, in 2024, SVdP served 43% more families than in 2023, highlighting the expanding need due to inflation and economic challenges. Thanks to the collective efforts of our church community, business partners, and tireless Vincentians, we continue to bring hope and relief to struggling families.
