My family and I have been involved in the life of a Catholic parish for as long as I can remember. I have an aunt who was an Adrian Dominican sister. My Dad was a lector, catechist, extraordinary minister of the Eucharist, and more. My brother and I were members of the choir, and on and on. I write this only to say that I know there are roles in parish life where the spotlight beams upon those who volunteer while others' sweat and tears are met with silence or a once-per-year volunteer appreciation dinner—if you are lucky. The same is true in many facets of life, as I'm sure you know.

Following last week's readings that focused on our "gifts," this week's second reading emphasizes the profound reality that we, as baptized Christians, are part of Christ's body and united as one: "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ" (1 Cor 12:12). Christ is our head, and we are the hands, legs, shoulders, and more — in the world today. If you were at a Mass that featured the longer version of this reading, you also heard that "the parts of the continued on page 3

As you are probably aware, Pope Francis has named 2025 (the 2025th anniversary of Jesus' birth) as a "Jubilee Year." Jubilee Year is a year set aside for prayer and for pilgrimages to the Vatican or to local national shrines and basilicas. The theme of Jubilee 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope." Announcing Jubilee 2025, Pope Francis wrote: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart, and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and

rebirth that we so urgently desire." A banner with the Jubilee 2025 Logo will be in our worship space beginning this weekend. The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other, indicating the unity and solidarity which should unite all people. The figure in the front is embracing the cross, a sign of faith and hope. There are rough waves under the figures symbolizing that life is not always calm. For this reason, we should pay close attention to the bottom part of the cross which is elongated and turned into the shape of an anchor, a well known symbol of hope. The logo

illustrates that the pilgrim's journey is not an individual undertaking but takes place in community. The cross also bends downward, not leaving us alone, but stretching out to us. At the bottom of the logo is the motto of Jubilee 2025: "Pilgrims of Hope."

body that seem to be weaker are all the more necessary" and "God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body...If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy" (v 24, 26). God's plan is for all to be valued, cared for, and appreciated, especially those within the body of Christ.

Think about all those who are involved in providing liturgies and programs within our faith communities. Whether paid staff or volunteers, recognize those who provide us with clean bathrooms, functioning heating and cooling systems, attractive bulletins, and clean floors, as well as those who lead us in prayer, teach us about the faith, sing, play instruments, pay the bills, and more! It takes effort from all of us, working together, to bring about all of the good that we accomplish. Moreover, just as Jesus proclaimed in today's gospel, his mission was/is about bringing "glad tidings" to those on the margins. We, too, as members of his body, are called to bring affirmation and positivity to those around us. Our

"good news," like Jesus', is about salvation through Christ, but it is also about building up and affirming each other so we can continue to spread the joy of the gospel.

This week, our challenge is to acknowledge the efforts and talents of others, whether inside or outside the body. By affirming others, we'll be building up God's kingdom here on earth, drawing others to Christ by our example. Try it out! May your kind words be contagious, and may your warm smiles serve as a boost to weary souls.

## Parish Enthronement to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

What is parish enthronement?

A parish enthronement to the Sacred Heart is a Catholic ceremony where a parish community formally dedicates their church space to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, symbolically inviting him to reign as king of love within their community, signifying a special commitment to live according to his love and mercy by placing a prominent image of the Sacred Heart in the church. Following the enthronement, parishioners are encouraged to continue practices like praying to the Sacred Heart, attending special Masses dedicated to the Sacred Heart, and striving to live out the values of love and forgiveness.

## What is the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus?

The practice of the devotion to the Sacred Heart came from a series of visions to St. Margaret Mary from 1673 to 1675. During these visions, Christ asked that this devotion spread, and he gave 12 promises to those who expose and honor the Sacred Heart image. The devotion is used as a symbol to represent his immense and boundless love for humanity, focusing on receiving and reciprocating that love through prayer and contemplation; it is considered a way to deeply connect with Jesus' divine mercy and compassion through the image of his wounded heart.

## What are the twelve promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus?

- I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- 5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- Sinners will find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.

- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- 9. I will bless every place in which an image of My Heart is exposed and honored.
- I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart.
- 12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

St. Isidore Church will be Enthroned to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on February 16 after the 11:30 Mass. Watch the Bulletin for additional information on this event.

## The Presentation of the Lord and Candlemas

In the Gospel of Luke, marking this Feast, Mary and Joseph presented the infant Jesus at the Temple in Jerusalem to consecrate him to the Lord God. Witnessing there, the elderly Simeon recognized Jesus as the Messiah and filled with the Holy Spirit, prophesied His impact on the world.

Candlemas, traditionally observed

by many Christian denominations, is not only a celebration of this momentous occasion but also an acknowledgment of Christ as the Light of the World. The ritual of blessing the candles symbolizes the spiritual light that Jesus brings into the world. Candles for use in the church and at home are blessed for use throughout the year, reflecting the faith that Jesus is the guiding light for humanity.

Candlemas serves as a reminder of Christ's presence in the world and calls the faithful to reflect on His light in their own lives. Jesus is the light of the world!

Bring your candles to Mass on the weekend of February 1 & 2. The Priests will be blessing church candles and candles from home before each Mass in the gathering space. We will then process into the church during the gathering song to begin our celebration of the Presentation of Our Lord. May we be the light of Christ to all those we meet!



## Climate Change on World Hunger

Social Justice Committee The last three popes, John Paul II, Benedict XVI, and Francis have called all Catholics to protect the environment as part of our duty as Christians. To protect human life and the earth. Among other things, they point out climate change is a big cause of world hunger.

Extreme weather conditions like floods, wildfires, droughts, cyclones and high temperatures can cause a decline in food production. Crops are reduced, destroyed or are failing completely.

Countries across the world are

experiencing more and more climate-related disasters. Severe drought is a leading cause of malnutrition in more than a third of the countries, which have had a rise in hunger levels in the last fifteen years.

For instance, in the Sehel region of Africa (including Niger, Mali and Chad), the rainy seasons are becoming more erratic. Droughts are leading to a decrease in food growth. Floods are also causing more outbreaks of diseases like cholera. Climate change is a long-term threat to food security and nutrition. It has been reported the risk of hunger and malnutrition could rise by 20% if we fail to reduce and prevent the diverse effects of climate change. What can we do to help, you might ask?
