It's easy to say, "I'm blessed." We say it when things are going well—when life feels stable, our needs are met, and we're surrounded by people we love. But do you ever stop and think about how blessed you really are? Do you recognize how quickly life can change?

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes, but He also issues a warning—the "woes." These aren't meant to be negative statements but, rather, wake-up calls. When Jesus says, "Woe to you," He is really saying, "Watch out!" He's reminding us that the things we may take for granted, like wealth, comfort, or popularity, can disappear in an instant.

If you base your sense of blessing

only on what you have, what happens when those things are gone? In addition, focusing only on your struggles risks missing the bigger picture—God's presence and the deeper blessings that don't fade away.

The Beatitudes challenge us to see blessings differently. Blessed are the poor, the hungry, the weeping *continued on page 3*

Following the 11:30 Mass today (Sunday, February 16), we will celebrate a service in which we will dedicate our parish to the "Sacred Heart of Jesus." Interestingly Pope Francis' recent pastoral letter, "Dilexit Nos." ("He Loves Us"), is a beautiful reflection on the important role the heart plays in our lives, and on the benefits of devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I encourage you to take the time to download and read this inspiring letter (QR Code link at end of this article). Pope Francis points out that the heart balances our reason, and integrates our personality. The heart is the locus of our passions, our strengths, our love, and perhaps, our hatred. He cites many philosophers and saints in sharing with us the importance of the heart. As Pope Francis points out, the "Sacred Heart of Jesus" reminds us that Jesus was fully human. He had a physical heart like all of us. God loves us with a human heart. Pope Francis writes: "Devotion to Christ's heart is essential for our Christian life to the extent that it expresses our openness in faith and adoration to the mystery of the Lord's divine and human love." Pope Francis reminds us that we are not obliged to believe the various visions and promises saints, who encouraged devotion to the Sacred Heart, have expressed as though they were the word of God. Yet. they can encourage our devotion to the Sacred Heart. (83) As the Holy Eucharist is a personal

encounter with the human and divine Christ, so is the contemplation of the image of the Sacred Heart. Pope Francis writes: "The venerable image portraying Christ holding out his loving heart also shows him looking directly at us, inviting us to encounter, dialogue and trust; it shows his strong hands capable of supporting us and his lips that speak personally to each of us." (54) It is the entire person of Christ that we encounter, not just his loving heart.

not because suffering is good, but because God is present in it. Being truly blessed isn't about having a perfect life; it's about knowing that God is constant, no matter what happens. He is our source of joy, peace, and strength, even when life gets hard. So, how can you focus on your blessings instead of your struggles? Maybe it's by shifting your perspective to see what you have—not what you lack. Perhaps it's by finding gratitude, even in the challenges. Still, maybe it's by remembering that no matter what changes, God never does. This week, take a moment to pause, notice the blessings in your life, and trust that God is walking with you in everything.


This Week's Intention: Adoring the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Did You Know? Sacred Heart of Jesus

On December 27, 1673, Jesus is reported to have said these words to St. Margaret Mary Alocoque, "My Divine Heart is so passionately in love with humanity that it can no longer contain within itself the flames of its ardent love. It must pour them out." The following year, Margaret had two other visions. In the first, Jesus's heart was on a throne enveloped in flames brighter than the sun and more transparent than crystal, surrounded by a crown of thorns. In the other, she saw Christ shining in glory. Flames of fire were coming out of every part of his chest to the point that it looked like a furnace." Additionally, Jesus asked that Catholics receive Holy Communion on the first Fridays of the month and adore Him in the Holy Eucharist. Friday is significant, of course, because it is the day of Our Lord's crucifixion by which he offered himself for our redemption in a supreme act of love.
