

Let's admit it: we all have people in our lives we do not like. And there are people who don't like us. "Liking" is an emotion. We do not have much control over our emotions. We cannot just decide to like somebody. But we can decide to find the good in people we may not like. We can decide to love them in spite of "not liking" them.

In our first reading this Sunday, David has an opportunity to kill King Saul. Saul has led an army of one thousand soldiers out to find David and kill him. (It seems like they REALLY do not like each other!) But David, who respects Saul as "God's Anointed," refuses to harm him. He finds the inherent good in Saul.

Each one of us is anointed by

God. God has made it that there is inherent good in every one of us. We must look beyond our "dislikes" and find the good, even in our enemies. The word "respect" comes from the same word as "spectacles:" We respect, or see, the inherent good of every one.

Welcoming Our New Archbishop

With great joy, we welcome Archbishop-elect Edward J. Weisenburger as the sixth Archbishop of Detroit! Appointed by Pope Francis, he succeeds Archbishop Allen H. Vigneron, who has faithfully served our archdiocese since 2009. Archbishop-elect Weisenburger will be installed on March 18 at the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Archbishop-elect Weisenburger, 64, comes to us from the Diocese of Tucson, Arizona, where he has served as bishop since 2017. Originally from Oklahoma, he was ordained a priest in 1987 and later earned a Licentiate in Canon Law. Over the years, he has served in many leadership roles, including vice chancellor, vicar general, and bishop of Salina, Kansas. His episcopal motto, "Behold the Lamb of God," reflects his deep faith and commitment to guiding the Church.


In his message to the faithful of Detroit, he shared, "I am humbled to be called to serve such a noble Church, known for its rich history, vibrant ministries, and dedicated clergy and laity." Archbishop Vigneron also extended a warm welcome, saying, "On behalf of all the people of God in the Archdiocese of Detroit, I extend to Archbishop Weisenburger a heartfelt welcome to his new home."

As we prepare to embrace our new shepherd, let us keep Archbishop-elect Weisenburger in our prayers. May the Holy Spirit guide him as he leads our archdiocese into the future, continuing the mission of evangelization and service to Christ.

St. Augustine, Bishop (354-430 A.D.)



Did You Know? St. Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna and Martyr

St. Polycarp was born between 69 and 70 A.D. of Christian parents. He learned the teachings of Christ directly from the Apostles and became a disciple of St. John the Evangelist. Irenaeus, who was his pupil and then Bishop of Lyon, and the historian, Eusebius of Caesarea, write of him thus, "Polycarp was not only educated by the Apostles and lived with many who had seen the Lord, but it was the Apostles who sent him to Asia as Bishop of the Church of Smyrna; there preserving the doctrine, spreading the Gospel among pagans, and fighting heresies. Described by Iranaeus as a patient and lovable preacher,

Polycarp had great solicitude for widows and slaves. When he was 86 years old and under the persecution of Christians by Emporer Antonio's Pius, the Proconsul urged him to recant his faith, cursing the Christ so he would be freed. Polycarp replied: "I have served Him for 86 years, and he has done me no harm. How could I curse my King who saved me? ... Listen clearly: I am a Christian". He remained unharmed from the flames as they attempted to burn him at the stake. Finally he was killed by the sword. He was martyred on February 23, 155.
