In this Sunday's passage from 1 Corinthians, St. Paul writes, "We are one body." On this Feast of Corpus Christi, we are reminded that we are made one body by sharing in the Body and Blood of Christ with each other.

Receiving Holy Communion is not only a personal experience; it also unites us with one another. We all share in the one bread and the one

cup—the Body and Blood of our Lord. As many grains form one loaf, so the "many" of us become one with each other. Sharing in the one cup is a ritual expression of how we are made one through Christ.

Part of the role of the Sign of Peace at Mass is to remind us that the same hand that reaches out to receive Christ in the Eucharist must also reach out to receive Christ in one

another. That is the reason we do this act just before receiving the Eucharist; it is a strong expression of how the Eucharist we are about to receive connects us all.

Ministering Holy Communion to the homebound and those in hospitals and nursing homes is an important part of our Church's ministry. It reminds those with whom we share the Eucharist that they are not alone.

The consecration is being observed as part of the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, inviting our nation to reflect not only on our history and freedoms, but also on our continued need for God's guidance and grace. The Sacred Heart of Jesus stands as a powerful sign of Christ's compassion, sacrifice, and enduring

invitation to place our trust in Him. In this historic anniversary year, the bishops of the United States are calling the faithful to pray for the renewal of our nation, our families, and our communities through this act of consecration. At a time when our country faces division, uncertainty, and many challenges, the Church turns again to the Heart of Jesus, asking for peace, healing, conversion, and hope.

St. Isidore Parish will mark this special occasion on Friday, June 12, with a parish celebration beginning with Eucharistic Adoration at 7:00 AM during which an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be

displayed for veneration and prayer. The morning will continue with Mass at 8:00 AM for the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and will include a Prayer of Consecration for the United States.

All parishioners are encouraged to attend and join together in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, asking the Sacred Heart of Jesus to bless our nation, strengthen our faith, and draw all people closer to His merciful love.

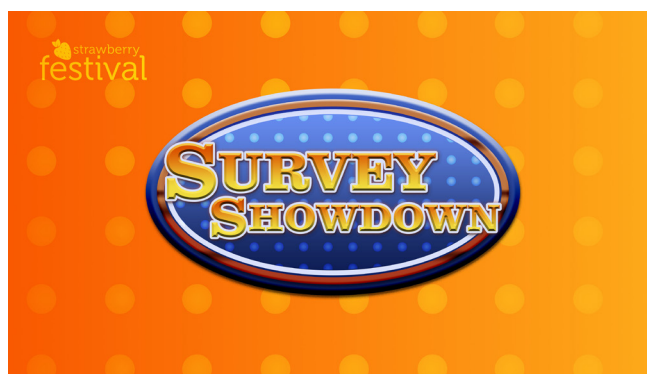
▶ K of C Breakfast - Thank You

Did You Know? Humility and Meekness

The understanding of humility can fittingly be introduced by meekness because the two virtues are bonded together. Many people don't like being considered as meek, thinking it as weak, uninspiring or boring. That is blatantly false. A truly meek person will possess great strength, ability and wisdom and know how to keep these excellent qualities under control. Meekness tells us that we don't need to be front-row center in every group photo or like the bride at the wedding. Meekness is an attractive quality that regulates one's conduct.

Humility, however is a way of thinking of others. The humble person knows other people have different strengths, abilities and degrees of knowledge. When you are humble you appreciate others, want to promote them to achieve their potential and support the common good. Meekness and humility intertwine to produce real outstanding people. Remember meek is not weak. Think, rather, of seek: Seek and find what Jesus meant when he said, "Learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29).

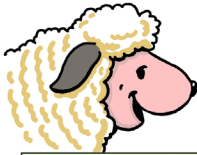

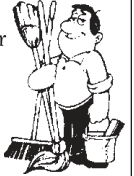

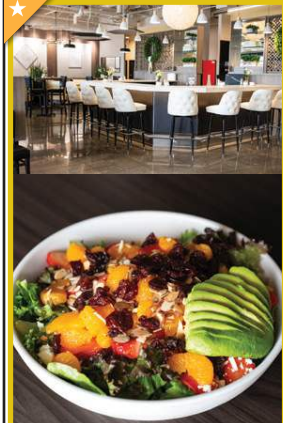
