This weekend's readings are a little different than those we would normally hear on the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Archdiocese of Detroit celebrates Saints Joachim and Anne as its patronesses, and as such, we are invited to reflect on the grandparents of Jesus.

At first glance, it might seem like an interruption to the normal Sunday readings, but it may be the exact

reminder we need. Our lives are filled with things competing for our time and attention. Work, sports, entertainment, social media, endless notifications, and busy schedules can easily become the centers of our lives without that ever being the intention. We often spend our best energy attending to what feels most deserving of our focus, while neglecting what is truly important.

The readings this weekend redirect our focus. Through Saints Joachim and Anne, God prepared the world for the coming of Jesus. Long before He was born, God was faithfully working through ordinary people, ordinary homes, and generations of family members who remained open to His plan. That raises an important question we should ask ourselves: What gets most of my time, energy, and attention?

► What are you willing to do to obtain the "Pearl of Great Price?"

Have you ever desired something so precious or important to you that you were willing to spend time searching and searching and searching for it until you found it? I promise you that whatever you were looking for was not nearly as precious as the Kingdom of Heaven!

This week Jesus continues to teach us in parables, one of which he compares the Kingdom of Heaven to a pearl of great value. Jesus makes the analogy that the Heavenly Kingdom is like a pearl of great price! If we over analyze Jesus' statement and teaching, we will lose the essence of His message. The point Jesus is making is that the Kingdom of Heaven has infinite great value – it will be our dwelling place for all eternity. The Kingdom of Heaven means we will be with God for all eternity basking in the light and warmth of His glory! There is nothing of greater value than eternity in Heaven! What are you willing to give up, or what are you willing to do to gain the Kingdom of

Heaven?

In today's Gospel Jesus uses a parable to explain what the kingdom of heaven is like -- He says, "The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price he goes and sells all that he has and buys it" (Mt. 13:45-46). In other words, the merchant is willing to give up everything to gain living in Heaven for all eternity.

In the parable, the merchant does not want the pearl, so that he can subsequently sell it and make a great profit – he wants the pearl because of its beauty, and he wants to behold it. While pearls were of extraordinary value in Jesus' time (much more valuable than they are today and much more valuable than diamonds), Heaven has infinite worth – it's priceless! The merchant sells all his worldly possessions to have this one, single pearl. So, what do you have to do to obtain this "pearl" Jesus is talking about? For starters,

get the clutter out of your life and make room for Jesus -- get rid of the obstacles that stand between you and Jesus for He is the key to the Kingdom of Heaven! What worldly things or persons (inordinate attachments) are keeping you from obtaining that "pearl" of great price – i.e., the Heavenly Kingdom? These things we must abandon for our true treasure lies in Heaven!

"Anyone who understands the Kingdom which Christ proposes realizes that it is worth staking everything to obtain it. ...The Kingdom of heaven is difficult to win. No one can be sure of achieving it, but the humble cry of a repentant man can open wide its doors" (J. Escrivá, Christ Is Passing By, 180).

Have a Blessed week, and keep your eyes fixed on Jesus!

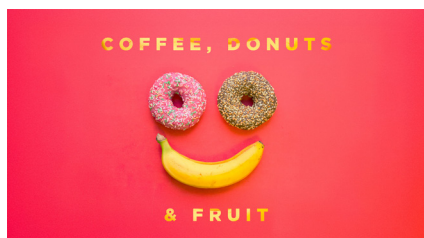

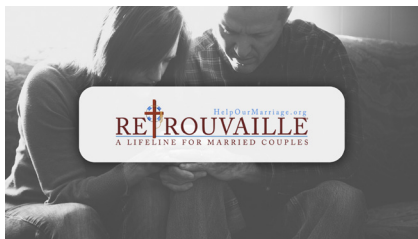

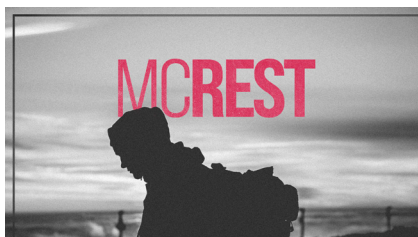

Did You Know?

ACTS: Prayer prompts for private Adoration.

Adoration: Adore the Lord by silently acknowledging that he is there. Let yourself be found in his loving gaze. You are a child of God; Jesus gave his life for you, and your company is welcomed by him. Allow the awe of the God of the Universe to fill you, a God who makes himself at home in the Eucharist, so that you can visit him and, with your whole self, approach his majesty. Offer simple praise for this moment of God's love.

Contemplation: This is the time for listening to what Jesus might say to you. You might begin with the practice of Lectio Divina, praying with Scripture. Maybe reading the Gospel or Psalm from the day's Mass and letting it speak to you. Or you might pray and meditate

on the mysteries of the Rosary or quietly do some other spiritual reading or journaling with God, taking pauses for private reflection.

Thanksgiving: Conclude your contemplation with a prayer of gratitude for Jesus' love. Then count your blessings with him and thank God for those gifts.

Supplication: Before you go, tell Jesus who or what is pressing on your mind. Offer your petitions asking for help or guidance. Ask in faith for the graces and strengths you need, including seeking healing or forgiveness for where you have fallen short. Ask his help to bring you to a sacramental confession soon.

▶ Connecting Point (con't)

Do we spend more time worrying about life's distractions than recognizing how God is working in our families? Do we remember that, through baptism, we have been born into God's family, or do we allow the pressures of daily life to define who we are? Do we make time for the grandparents, parents, and elderly individuals who have helped shape our faith, or are they too easily pushed aside because life feels too busy?

Saints Joachim and Anne remind us that holiness is often built quietly over time. It is formed in families, faithful relationships, and the simple decision to keep God at the center of our lives.

This week, notice where your time and energy really go. Where your attention leads often reveals what you value most. Then, ask yourself: Am I giving my best attention to the things that lead me closer to God—or merely to the things that keep me busy?



▶ K of C Highway Cleanup

Have you ever driven on M53 between 27 and 29 Mile Roads? You will hopefully not have noticed much trash on the passenger side of the road. For the last 35 years the Knights of Columbus Council 7200 has adopted both the Northbound and Southbound roadsides of this stretch of highway through the Adopt-A-Highway program. We pick up trash along this stretch three times per year. On Saturday, 7/11/26, 12 people spent 1 and a half hours each picking up trash during our second such session this year. ► Congestive Heart Failure

Heart failure, sometimes known as congestive heart failure, occurs when the heart can't pump blood effectively to the lungs or the rest of the body. If a person has developed a weakened heart muscle or their heart muscle has thickened or stiffened, the heart has difficulty filling and backs up blood into the lungs. With heart failure, the weakened heart pumps less blood and causes the kidneys and adrenal glands to produce chemicals that hold on to salt and water. Because the body is retaining salt and water or the heart is unable to pump blood forward, water may pool in the legs and ankles, causing them to swell. Fluid may also collect in the lungs and interfere with the ability to breathe, especially when lying down. Additionally, blood vessels constrict, and blood pressure rises, making it even harder for the heart to push blood through the arteries.

Congestive heart failure affects about 5 million Americans. Roughly 550,000 people are diagnosed with heart failure each year. It is the leading cause of hospitalization in people older than 65.

Symptoms of heart failure include:

- Shortness of breath upon

exertion or lying down (leading to sleeping with extra pillows)

- Swelling of legs, ankles, or feet (due to fluid buildup)
- Suddenly waking up short of breath
- Reduced exercise tolerance (daily tasks may feel harder than before)
- Swollen abdomen (due to fluid collecting in the belly)
- Confusion or poor concentration (due to reduced blood flow to the brain)
- Rapid, racing, fluttering, or irregular heartbeat
- Persistent cough or wheezing, sometimes with frothy sputum (due to fluid in the lungs)
- Rapid weight gain (more than five pounds within a few days) (due to fluid retention)
- Increased need to urinate
- Fatigue and weakness (due to less oxygen-rich blood)
- Chest pain (if caused by a heart attack)

Not all conditions that lead to heart failure can be reversed, but treatments can improve the signs and symptoms of heart failure and help you live longer. Lifestyle changes, such as controlling blood pressure and blood sugar (if you have diabetes), taking medications,

exercising, reducing sodium in your diet, managing stress, and losing weight, can improve your quality of life.

If you think you might be experiencing signs or symptoms of heart failure, it is important to follow up with your doctor or healthcare provider.

On Thursday, August 6, from 12 to 1 PM, following the Rambling Roses meeting, Dr. Edouard Daher of Eastlake Cardiovascular will present a lecture in the Social Hall on cardiac diseases, signs and symptoms, and treatment options.
