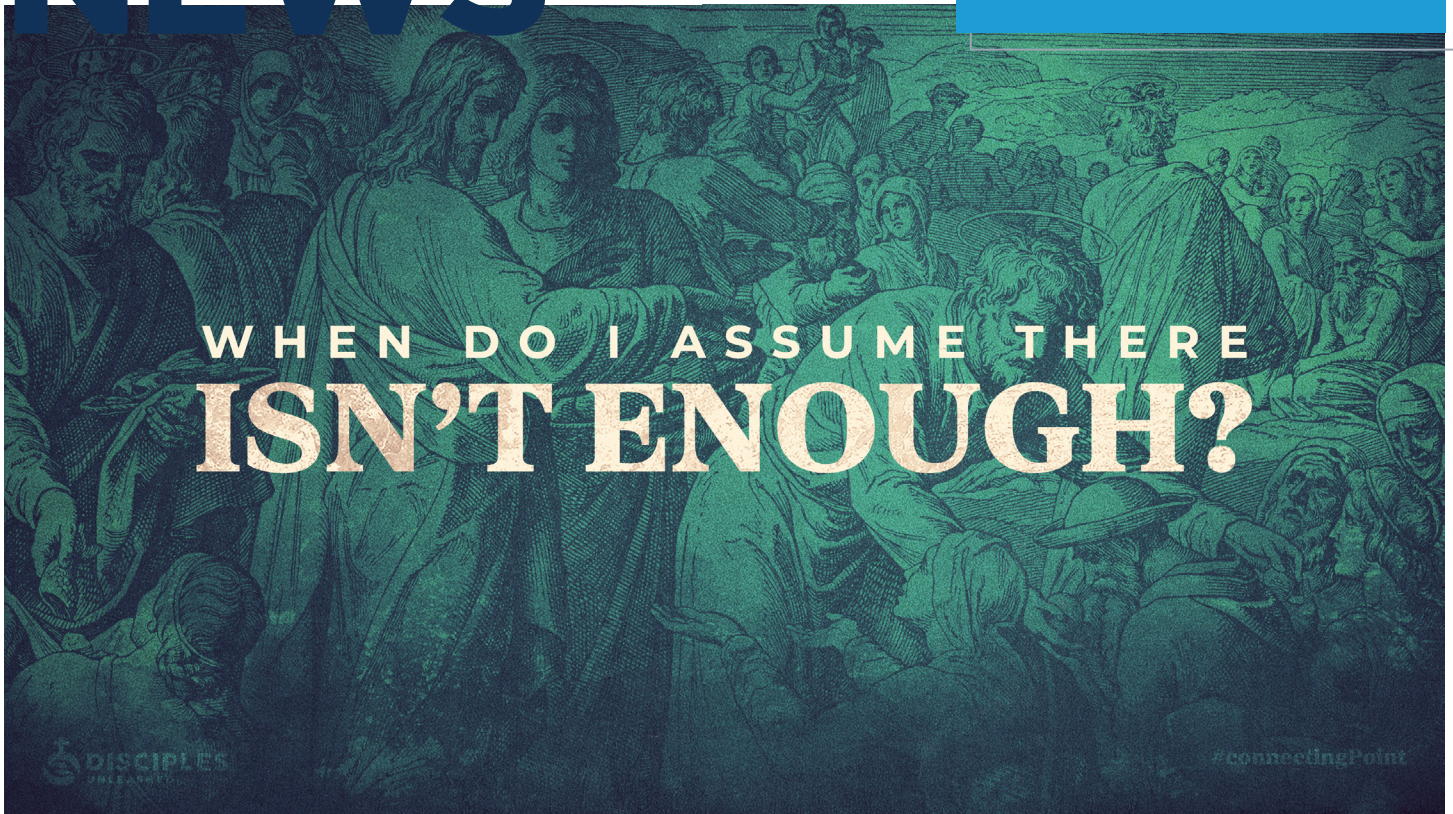

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear the familiar story of Jesus feeding the crowd with five loaves and two fish. After reading it, it's easy to focus on the miracle itself and think, "Wow! How amazing that Jesus could multiply such a small amount of food."

Meanwhile, we're saying things like, "There just aren't enough hours in the day," "I don't have the patience

or energy for this," or "I can't afford that."

It's easy, and probably human nature, to feel like we don't have enough. In fact, that's exactly what the disciples did. Before Jesus performs the miracle, they come to Him essentially saying, "We don't have enough." They could only see the limited resources in front of them.

The truth is we aren't that different. How often do we say we don't have enough time to pray or attend a bible study but somehow find time to scroll on social media or watch the latest episode of our favorite show? How often do we say we don't have enough patience for someone who's struggling, but we can somehow find it for someone or something that matters more to us? How often do we convince ourselves that we don't

▶ Jesus, The Bread of Life

"The way to a man's heart is through his stomach" so the saying goes. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus appears to apply a similar adage: the way to a person's soul is through the stomach! We hear in Sacred Scripture that the kings ("shepherds") of Israel were not feeding their sheep with God's word. The Israelites were hungry to hear the word of God but were led astray instead – the sheepfold was being scattered, because they lacked a shepherd to care for them (Ezekiel 34:1-6). The prophet Jeremiah prophesied, however, that God would indeed send a shepherd who will care for, and feed, His sheep (i.e., God's people) (Jeremiah 23:4). Jesus, is of course, that Shepherd of Whom Jeremiah prophesied. Jesus fed, feeds, and will continue to feed God's people. First, Jesus feeds His followers with physical bread to satiate their physical hunger as we heard about in this Sunday's Gospel passage from St. Matthew (Mat. 14:13-21) with the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand men (probably more like

twenty thousand including women and children). Jesus first satisfies the peoples' physical hunger, so to prepare them to receive the most important food – the food that will satiate their very souls – the Bread of Life come down from Heaven – Jesus Himself, the living Word! In St. John's version of this story, after the feeding of the people, Jesus departs from there, but the people follow Him, not because they want to hear Jesus' words of everlasting life, but because they want to fill their bellies with food, again! Jesus is very direct with them, and He tells them exactly that the reason they run after Him is to have their bellies filled, again (Jn. 6:26-27). But Jesus explains to them that there is bread they will receive that when eaten will give them eternal spiritual satiation – this Bread will give them eternal life (Jn. 6:35). Jesus knows, however, that for his followers to be open to this spiritual food He will give them, their physical hunger must first be satisfied. Jesus does just that – He feeds the people with physical, earthly bread that they are prepared to receive the Bread

from Heaven. Jesus truly cares for both our physical well-being in this life as well as our spiritual welfare thus preparing us to share life with Him for all eternity. Jesus is concerned with the whole of our lives. Likewise, we also must be diligent in caring for both the physical and spiritual aspects of our lives. Some people take great lengths to keep in great physical shape, but they neglect their spiritual health, and vice-versa. While we cannot see, weigh, or measure our souls, they are the part of us that lasts forever – the soul is the very essence of the human person.

Are you prepared to receive Jesus, the Bread of life? Does your soul long for the living Word, eternal life, that only comes from Jesus Himself?

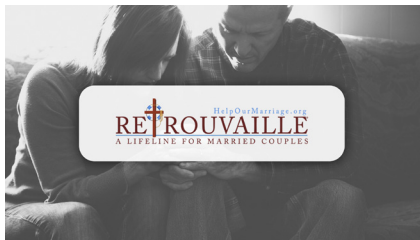

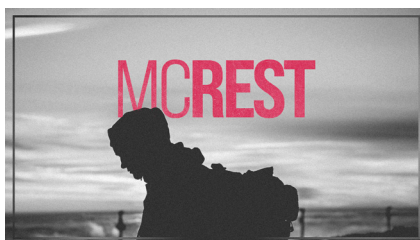

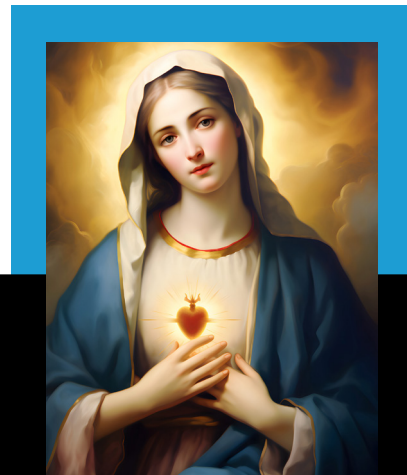

Did You Know? Immaculate Heart of Mary

The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This devotion emphasizes Mary's profound love for God, her pure virtues, and her deep desire to bring all people closer to her son, Jesus.

The Heart of Mary: Unlike the Sacred Heart of Jesus (which is adored), the Immaculate Heart of Mary is venerated as a symbol of Mary's inner spiritual life and maternal love.

Fatima & World War II: The month became strongly associated with this devotion due to the Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima and Pope Pius XII's consecration of the world to the Immaculate Heart during World War II.

The challenge for us is learning to trust that abundance. The disciples didn’t need more bread or fish; they needed to trust Jesus with the little they had. Once they placed it in His hands, it became more than enough.
